Orders for Orchid Bark

If you have more than a few orchids, you have probably searched for orchid mix at Home Depot, Lowe's, and your local nursery. You may even have shopped online for orchid mix. Somewhere along the line you probably found a 4 quart (1 gallon) bag for \$5+ that was a good start but not enough to make a serious dent in your repotting needs.

If you happened to be at the Denver Orchid Society's November meeting, you heard Nick Snakenberg mention the potting mixes he uses for orchids at the Denver Botanical Gardens. One of the ingredients he uses in making several of the mixes was Rexius fir bark. Their bark comes in fine, medium and large grades. It is heat treated to reduce pathogens. Unfortunately, Rexius is predominately a wholesale supplier (8 pallet minimum order). That vastly exceeds the needs of the average hobby grower.

I have done some research and found a retail program that would allow DOS to get a single pallet of Rexius fir bark delivered. Each bag on the pallet holds 2 cu. ft. (15 gallons) of bark. A pallet holds approximately 60 bags. And we can mix the grades on the pallet. To make such a purchase worthwhile, DOS would need to charge approximately \$29 per bag for the bark. And we would need to have commitments for approximately 45 bags. At the January DOS meeting I got commitments from members for approximately 15 bags of bark. If you are interested in purchasing bark please email me at genovajoseph@yahoo.com and tell me how many bags and what grades you would be interested in. Hopefully we can get enough interest to make this purchase possible.

If you are interested in other bulk orchid media, such as Orchiata, let me know. If you have local sources for other orchid media, let me know as well.

President's Message

I am presently very enthusiastic about our opportunity to tour the orchid greenhouses at the Denver Botanic Gardens. I have been on previous tours but there is always something new to notice or be in bloom.

The orchid collection at DBG is made up mostly of species orchids. That collection exists as a gene bank of plants that are or may soon be extinct. The group at DBG doesn't obviously contain anywhere near all the orchid species known but in conjunction with many other gardens and collections can represent a great number of the known orchid species. Through the sharing of genetic material through pollen or seed pods, there can exist a more complete representation of orchid species with their unique physical properties.

As civilization continues to encroach, many species, including orchids, are facing extinction in the wild due to habitat loss. Some species, like our Bald Eagle, have been brought back from very low numbers due to various conservation efforts. This might not always work in the case of certain orchid species as their habitat requirements are so specific that destruction of their preferred growing areas make them unable to live in the wild.

Conserving orchids by saving this gene pool diversity in gardens might restore certain growth characteristics or flower colors and shapes to the orchids we can get.

Our contributions toward habitat conservation and support for organizations like the Denver Botanic Gardens can result in better orchid flowers in the long term. Keep up the good work.




