President's Message

I'm ready for Spring. I'm REALLY ready for Spring. Sorry we missed our meeting last month but the weather kinda dictated that issue. Now it really is spring so we'll hope for the best.

Wednesday was really a bad day here. Snow and wind and blowing snow and it was a good day to just watch out the window and appreciate our heated home. But then the electricity went away in early afternoon. Not an uncommon event that usually may take a couple hours to fix. The next day a neighbor learned from the power company that it would be fixed by 4:40. That's pushing it a bit but I figured we could tough it out till then. As it was getting cool, I brought up my generator and hooked up some heaters. Later I hooked the generator into the plugs in the greenhouse and turned on a couple oil heaters for a while.

By 9:00 pm it was getting boring and dark, so I went to bed leaving the generator running connected to the house. Figured when it stopped I'd gas it up and take it back to the greenhouse.

About 10:30 my wife woke me with the good news that the power was back on. So I jumped out of bed, well I got up anyhow, shut off the generator and rolled up the extension cord so we could shut the door. My remote thermometer indicated the greenhouse was heating up nicely but when it reached 77 I felt it was necessary to go check. Anyhow the heater sensor was in a cool corner and my thermometer wasn't. But all turned out OK. Might have lost a few buds on my Phals but otherwise no visible damages.
