Need Roots?? (Adpated by: T. Bernard)

A Bag Method for Growing Roots on Rootless Orchids-Cattleya

 Place the rootless plant in an empty Vanda-type basket. Secure the plant in the center of the basket so it won't tip over and break new roots as they develop (Pic 1):



• Dampen sphagnum moss with your normal fertilizer water. Put the basket in a plastic bag (2-one gallon zip lock bags; one for top and one for bottom). Add sphagnum moss around the outside perimeter of the basket; 1/3-1/2 way around. Note: Don't add too much water as the moisture will drip on plant. Cover the top of the plant with the other zip lock bag and clip the bottom zip to the top with a clip or rubber band to contain the entire plant. Don't put holes in the bag (Pic 2):



Place the contained plant in a bright preferably, eastern-facing window. Check it weekly and re-dampen the moss to keep moisture on the bag walls (condensate).

After 5-8 weeks roots and possibly, new growth, should appear and the plant may be repotted as usual for your conditions. Picture 3 below shows Blc. Willett Wong "The Best" at **6.5**
