President's Message

Thankfully the weather is becoming more spring-like. Nice weather makes me more enthusiastic to get out and do outdoor stuff but also to get busy with my orchid repotting and other plant maintenance.

Three weeks ago, I braced myself and proceeded to dunk all my orchids. Dunking is recommended to flush out any extra minerals and fertilizer out of the plant medium. I feel it is also the best way to make sure that all the plant roots and medium are surely exposed to water.

Other benefits are also accomplished. As I pick each plant off the bench, I often find there are roots that have grown through the bench or maybe even into the neighboring pots. This means that I must be careful about moving each plant to avoid spilling a pot, sometimes necessitating repotting. If the drain hole of the pot is not clogged, the speed of the water flowing up through the medium indicates the openness of the medium. Thick medium may be decomposing enough to choke the plant roots, I also have the date of last repot on the label so I can see how long it's been since the orchid was repotted. It is also interesting to see if the plant has new flower spikes coming or new bulbs starting. New roots starting can be a good indication that this would be a good time to repot the orchid.

Growing orchids is kinda like practicing medicine or law. no hard and fast rules just keep practicing and learning.




