The Office of Tenebrae is an ancient liturgy dating back to the 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> century A.D. The word Tenebrae means *darkness* or *shadows*. The liturgy is composed of readings and successive extinguishing of candles until the church is left in darkness. The gradual loss of light symbolizes the ebb of Jesus' life and the darkness which surrounded Calvary on Good Friday. Different versions of the Tenebrae liturgy exist. This setting of Tenebrae is based on the Seven Last Words of Christ on the Cross. Following the last reading and the Lord's Prayer, the Christ Candle will be removed from the chancel for a time symbolizing Christ's death. The *Strepitus* is heard, a harsh noise indicating the stone closing the tomb and the earthquake at the time of Jesus's death. The Christ Candle returns to the sanctuary in anticipation of our Lord's resurrection. At the conclusion of the liturgy, we ask our worshipers to leave the church in silence to honor the solemnity of Christ's death and the sacrifice he endured for our sins.

# The First Word - Luke 23:33-34

<sup>33</sup>When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. <sup>34</sup>Then Jesus said, **"Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing."** And they cast lots to divide his clothing.




"For - give them, Fa - ther," thus He prays; "They know not what they do."

# The Second Word - Luke 23:39-43


<sup>39</sup>One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" <sup>40</sup>But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? <sup>41</sup>And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." <sup>42</sup>Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." <sup>43</sup>He replied, **"Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."**

#### The Third Word - John 19:25-27

<sup>25</sup>Meanwhile, standing near the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. <sup>26</sup>When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, **"Woman, here is your son."** <sup>27</sup>Then he said to the disciple, **"Here is your mother."** And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.



#### The Fourth Word - Matthew 27:45-48

<sup>45</sup>From noon on, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. <sup>46</sup>And about three o'clock Jesus cried with a loud voice, **"Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?"** that is, **"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"** <sup>47</sup>When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, "This man is calling for Elijah." <sup>48</sup>At once one of them ran and got a sponge, filled it with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink.




#### The Fifth Word - John 19:28-29

<sup>28</sup>After this, when Jesus knew that all was now completed, he said (in order to fulfill the scripture), **"I am thirsty."** <sup>29</sup>A jar full of sour wine was standing there. So they put a sponge full of the wine on a branch of hyssop and held it to his mouth.



# The Sixth Word - John 19:30

<sup>30</sup>When Jesus had received the wine, he said, **"It is finished."** Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.




# The Seventh Word - Luke 23:44-56

<sup>44</sup>It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, <sup>45</sup>while the sun's light failed; and the curtain of the temple was torn in two. <sup>46</sup>Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said, **"Father, into your hands I commend my spirit."** Having said this, he breathed his last. <sup>47</sup>When the centurion saw what had taken place, he praised God and said, "Certainly this man was innocent." <sup>48</sup>And when all the crowds who had gathered there for this spectacle saw what had taken place, they returned home, beating their breasts. <sup>49</sup>But all his acquaintances, including the women who had followed him from Galilee, stood at a distance, watching these things.

<sup>50</sup>Now there was a good and righteous man named Joseph, who, though a member of the council, <sup>51</sup>had not agreed to their plan and action. He came from the Jewish town of Arimathea, and he was waiting expectantly for the kingdom of God. <sup>52</sup>This man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus.

<sup>53</sup>Then he took it down, wrapped it in a linen cloth, and laid it in a rock-hewn tomb where no one had ever been laid. <sup>54</sup>It was the day of Preparation, and the sabbath was beginning. <sup>55</sup>The women who had come with him from Galilee followed, and they saw the tomb and how his body was laid. <sup>56</sup>Then they returned, and prepared spices and ointments.

On the sabbath they rested according to the commandment.
