Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.


Most merciful God,

Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?" ⁵Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. ⁶What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from



above.' ⁸The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. 
