



Thanksgiving for Baptism

Let us pray...

Let us pray.


We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your daughters and sons new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life.

O God, you are Fire: transform us with hope.


O God most majestic, O God most motherly,


SUNDAY SCHOOL RESUMES!


MLC will be making beignets again at the Milton Harvest Festival on Saturday, September 17.

A JOURNEY THROUGH LUTHER'S SMALL CATCECHISM


