



After taking a break for the summer our volunteer crew is ready to resume taking pictures for our new church directory. Be sure to stay after worship and get your picture taken!


FELLOWSHIP TIME

Each month we will focus on a chapter in Julie Yarbough's Beyond the Broken Heart: A Journey Through Grief. Copies of the book are available in the church office.


Maybe you know someone struggling with grief? This group is open to everyone, feel free to let them know we are gathering.




