Update on the Getting Ahead Program

In June, the Milton Lutheran Parish made a positive difference in the lives of local families who are working to overcome poverty situations through the Getting Ahead in the Valley initiative. Poverty is a community problem, and it requires community solutions. In Union and Northumberland counties, 12.9% of residents live at the Federal Poverty Line (family of four = \$26,500/yr). This is not a "do for" programthis is a "be with" and "do with" community engagement initiative.

Since June, we've learned to calculate debit to income ratios, investigate time management, completed individual stability scales, the theory of change, research on what causes poverty, and the hidden rules of economic class. Most recently, our Getting Ahead group learned about the importance of language concepts that can improve interactions and build respectful relationships, resolve conflicts, and exchange information. Also, we learned how to use language to help prepare our children to learn and be more successful in school.

Yes! We have been very busy and moving forward. Thank you to all our volunteers and community supporters!

TRYING SMALL

An update from Brian Palmer – ELCA Pastor/Missionary serving in Totota, Liberia. Me, Bobby, Amos and Najohn

My Business

A couple months ago I told you all I would be in the United States this summer and, indeed, as I write

this I am in Florida. Several congregations expressed an interest in my visiting in person; sadly that has not been an option. Due to COVID, in person visits are not permitted and the reason I came to the States is to seek medical intervention. There are murmurs that there is gonna be a big missionary shin-dig (i.e. meeting) in August of 2022 and my hope is the stars will align so as to allow in person congregational visits. I will keep you informed. In the meantime, anybody who would like a virtual visit or meeting just needs to let me know. Two recent activities stand out for me as kinda cool. The first is online teaching for the seminary. Most of you know I teach at the Gbarnga School of Theology (GST) in Gbarnga. The dean and I have been talking for a while about GST offering online classes and what with my medical needs conspiring with increased COVID cases in Liberia this seemed the perfect time to start. The semester started about 4 weeks before my coming to Florida and will continue for several weeks after my return to Liberia. These are the face-to-face bookends of six weeks of my online teaching. The two classes I am currently teaching online are Old Testament Exegesis and Christian Ethics. It's going well...not great...but okay.

The second new and different activity I was recently involved in was to oversee the installation

of a solar system for the Laboratory of a hospital in

Foya. Foya is in the bushy-bush-bush. The installation team is in the picture to the right. They are a great bunch of guys who are eager to learn. It is amazing what a little effort can do. "We Came for Our Christmas"

By far the two biggest holidays of the year in Liberia are Christmas and Independence Day, which is July 26th. As far as I can tell they are celebrated in nearly identical ways: The girls get

their hair done and all the children walk about in new clothes getting praised. The food is better and more abundant, not to mention the booze; lots of booze. As the children are passing around many will come to my house and say, "We came for our Christmas," or "We came for our 26th" which roughly translates to, "Trick or treat." Many people give the children small money as a way of thanking them for looking so great. I usually give out stick candy (lollypops) or gum or some other random small thing. This gone April I had a group of about 6 children stop at my house. They ranged in age from 3 to 8 or 9. They looked great all decked out in their new clothes and hair and plastic sunglasses. I asked what was going on and got, "We came for our Christmas." The puzzlement on my face got a, "We came for our 26th." I was baffled. After a minute of me going on about how fine they looked I finally got the missing piece, "We are Mandingo." That means Muslim...It was Ramadan! We all showed our teeth, proud of having reached our goal of communicating. I gave them all small money and a lot of praise and thanked them for stopping. It was lovely. I look forward to seeing them again next year.

Masking Policy

Starting Sept 6th Masks must be worn by everyone while inside the church building. As the cases continue to climb in our area it is important to do what we can to mitigate the spread of the virus. This is for worship, all events, and meetings at the church. Keep in mind that exposure to the virus either by a member or the staff would require us to quarantine for 10 days as a congregation which would close the office and place all church ministry online. While we recognize that wearing a mask is uncomfortable our hope is to minimize the possibility of spread, maximizing our

opportunities to gather in person. Thank you for your cooperation and consideration.

Confirmation and Youth Group

We are excited to share that we will be working with United In Christ Lutheran Church in West Milton to provide the opportunity for our teens in grades 7th-12th to gather together and enrichen their faith experience. Pastor Justin Lingenfelter and Pastor Gary together will be to leading these experiences for our families.

Confirmation (Grades 7th and 8th)

- 1. Confirmation instruction the **first Sunday of every month at 5:00pm.**
- 2. Summer Servant Trip- Working together with Camp Mount Luther and other congregations in the synod we will provide a summer servant trip for junior high students.
- 3. Shared Ministry Event- The teens from MLP and UIC will work together to plan and lead a shared ministry event for both congregations.
- 4. The confirmation program itself will be a two-year program.

Youth Group (Grades 7th-12th)

- 1. We will be holding Youth Group (grades 7-12) on the first and third Sundays of each month beginning around 6:00pm and ending by 8:00pm.
- **2.** Youth Group will begin with a meal for students, so those attending confirmation beforehand will have dinner provided those evenings.

The launch date will be our first night of Youth Group on Sunday, September 19th at 6:00pm! The first formal Confirmation class will then be Sunday, October 3rd at 5:00pm.

To keep things simple, we will be meeting at United In Christ until we are able to help establish a routine for our teens. Following our first youth group time there will be brief meeting for parents that will start at 7:30 P.M.

Upcoming Meetings & Events


Thursday, September 2nd at 7:00 P.M Ministry Team Meetings

Recipes - YUM!

These recipes are out of the cookbooks that each church created; these recipes were shared by members. Here are some recipes for all our corn lovers. It's in season so get it while it lasts and support our local farmers too! Enjoy!



Corn Muffins

Ingredients

3/4 Cups Sugar

2 Eggs

2 Cups Flour

Pinch of salt

½ cup Butter

1 Cup Corn Meal

4 Teaspoons baking powder

1 ½ cup milk

Optional: Add ¾ cup cooked corn kernels (preferably cut from a cob) and ¼ cup fresh chopped basil <u>Instructions - Mix all ingredients together.</u> Grease a muffin pan with butter, Bake in a muffin pan at 350 degrees until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Or for a more traditional feel, bake in a buttered cast iron 10-inch pan at 350 degrees. Let cool and cut into triangles and serve. These are soooo good for breakfast with honey butter!

Corn Fritters

This is a great way to use left over corn on the cob. You will need an oil thermometer and a skillet that can hold about $\frac{1}{2}$ inch deep hot oil. Set pot on stove, add oil and thermometer, they usually hang on the side, let it heat up while you put together the ingredients. The oil needs to reach 350 to 375 degrees. Otherwise, your fritters will be greasy.

Ingredients

Cut the corn off 3 Large Ears of corn (after cooked and cooled enough to handle)

- 3 Eggs (separated into yolks and white)
- 3 Tablespoons Flour

Salt and Pepper to taste

***Add a dash of your favorite hot sauce for a little extra spice or some chopped fresh cilantro a unique flavor. Instructions

Place egg white in a bowl and beat until soft peaks form. (a stand mixer works great for this)

Combine Corn, Egg Yolks, Flour and Salt & Pepper, Gently fold in the beaten egg whites, then immediately drop by tablespoon full into the hot oil. Let fry on each side until golden brown (2-3 minutes) Drain on paper towels. Don't be too impatient, they can be HOT, let cool sprinkle lightly with salt is desired and eat!
