A Letter from the Pastor

The Power of Small: Why Small Group Ministry Matters

In July and August our congregation is participating in conversations about implementing a small group ministry here at MLC. We are still in the initial planning stages, but I thought I would take some time to talk about the importance of Small Group ministry and the benefits it would bring to our community.

In a world where it's easy to feel disconnected—even in a crowded room—small group ministry offers something profoundly simple: community. At its heart, small group ministry is about building relationships, deepening faith, and walking with one another in the journey of life and discipleship.

Why Small Groups?

From the very beginning, the church was built on small communities of believers who gathered in homes to pray, share meals, and encourage one another. Acts 2:46 tells us that "day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts." The early church didn't rely on large buildings or elaborate programs. They relied on connection.

Small groups today continue that ancient pattern. They provide a space where people are truly seen and heard, where questions can be asked freely, and where spiritual growth can flourish in the soil of trust and authenticity.

What Happens in a Small Group?

Small groups come in many forms—Bible studies, prayer circles, book discussions, service teams—but they all share common elements: care, connection, and Christ-centered conversation. Some groups meet weekly, others bi-weekly or monthly. Some are short-term around a theme or topic; others grow into long-term spiritual friendships.

In these gatherings, people support one another through life's ups and downs. They celebrate joys, carry burdens, pray together, and explore God's Word in ways that apply to daily life. As relationships deepen, so does discipleship.

Why It Matters Now More Than Ever

We live in a time when loneliness is widespread and meaningful connection is rare. While Sunday worship is vital and beautiful, it can be hard to connect deeply in an hour-long service. Small groups fill that gap. They are places where spiritual friendships take root, faith is shared, and lives are transformed—not just individually, but communally

I'm looking forward to continuing this conversation about small group ministry at MLC and the possibility of small groups taking hold in our community.

Council news

Council has appointed Nevin Yost as the contact person with the Community Mennonite Church. They will be renting 100 Mahoning Street beginning in October.

Council has appointed a Building Research Team. This team will do additional research on items that have emerged through the facilities assessment and subsequent meetings. Some of the items to be looked at are: Estimated cost of upgrades and renovations to both buildings, revenue needs to sustain both buildings long term, cost of sewer for 1125 Mahoning, assessment of elevator at 100 Mahoning Street, parking lot resurfacing at both buildings, and additional research on selling both buildings. The task force consists of Kevin Frey, chairman; Linwood Hill, Dave Campbell, Rich Handy and Pastor Gary.

Council has decided to meet with Pastor Sonja Ware to decide if they want to have her help us move forward. Pastor Ware has been a part of a church merger and brings experiences that she has gained through that process. Council will be meeting with her in August.

Outreach Team

The Outreach team would like to share that we are continuing to collect school items in partnership with United in Christ to distribute during open house events at the Milton Area School District. Items we are collecting include pencils, crayons, folders, glue sticks, and markers. We will be hosting a booth space on both weekends of the Milton Harvest Festival. We are hosting a Cake Wheel on Saturday, September 6th and are looking for volunteers to work at the booth as well as donations of baked good items (cakes, cupcakes, pies, cookies etc.) both homemade or store bought. Additional donations can include produce (watermelons/cantaloupes/pumpkins) and bags of candy. The second Saturday, September 13th, we will be doing our annual beignet stand. We are in need of volunteers to mix dough the day prior (Friday September 12th) and people to work the stand on parade day. Please see the binder in the lobby for sign up times. The Outreach team will also be collecting woman's and children's winter hats, gloves, scarves and blankets again this year for Women in Transition. 
