A Season of Thankfulness

As we head into November and the Thanksgiving holiday, we're reminded once again of the importance of gratitude. The world tells us to be thankful for the things we have, but as followers of Christ, we know that thankfulness runs deeper than possessions or circumstances. Our gratitude is rooted in the grace of God—the One who daily provides for us and who, through Jesus Christ, gives us life, forgiveness, and hope.

Martin Luther once wrote that "everything that we have is daily given and preserved by God's goodness and mercy." In the Small Catechism, Luther explains the First Article of the Creed by saying that God gives us all that we need—"our body and soul, eyes, ears, and all our members, our reason and all our senses... clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, spouse and children, fields, livestock, and all we own." And then he adds, "for all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him."

Gratitude, then, is not just a feeling we have once a year—it's the response of faith to the goodness of God. We give thanks not because life is always easy, but because God is always faithful. Even in seasons of loss, change, or uncertainty, we trust that His grace is sufficient and His promises are sure.

This Thanksgiving, take a moment to pause and reflect on the gifts God has placed in your life—your family, your church, your daily bread, and above all, the saving love of Jesus Christ. Consider, too, how you might share that thankfulness through acts of service and kindness. In doing so, we live out our callings as God's people in the world—loving our neighbors as Christ has first loved us.

As a congregation, may we continue to be a community marked by gratitude, generosity, and grace.

God has richly blessed us so that we may be a blessing to others.

October was a very busy month for the MLC Hiking Group! There were 5 hikes with something for everyone!

Saturday 10/4: Canyon Vista Trail with the Cold Run Loop @ Worlds End State Park. This was a scenic 5.3 mile loop trail, and we had 12 hikers (including four year old Rob Buck who hiked the entire trail!) and a baby carried by his mother, Brenna Buck. After the hike we had refreshments at The Barn, just outside the park.



Friday 10/10: Three of us traveled to Pine Grove Furnace State Park to do a 3 mile hike on the Appalachian

Trail and visit the AT Museum, which is the midpoint of the entire AT. 




MOVERS & SHAKERS SENIOR'S GROUP


