## Message from Parish Council

Greetings to our Fellow Milton Lutheran Parish Members,

Your Parish Council would like to take this opportunity to give you an update on what is happening within our Parish. As you will see below, we are active and working to move forward as a Parish.

With Pastor Mark leaving us, the Parish Council has begun the process with the synod to find a new interim pastor. We have submitted forms to the synod describing our needs and requirements for a part-time interim pastor. The part-time interim would be a similar position to the part-time interims that each congregation had before Pastor Mark arrived, but now that we are a parish, there will be one interim pastor to serve both congregations.

Starting in August, we will utilize authorized lay worship leaders and supply pastors to lead our Sunday services. We have requested that our new interim pastor conduct Sunday services occasionally when his or her schedule permits. This is something that we will need to discuss with the new interim pastor and will let you know what we can establish.

The Parish Council is in the early stages of preparing for a new series of congregational conversations with parish members to discuss how all of us can best work together to meet our mission goals. More information will be coming this fall.

The Call Committee is ready to interview potential candidates for our full time pastor position, but at this time the synod has no candidates to present. Please continue to be patient and keep the Call Committee in your prayers.

As always, please don't hesitate to ask questions of any of our Congregation Council and Parish Council members.

## Congregational Conversations 2.0

Small group meetings in the fall of 2018 led the Milton Lutheran Parish to develop our new mission and vision while giving all participants voice in a structured and consistent Q & A format. This fall the next phase of congregational conversations will be scheduled with the purpose of determining how we can best reach our mission and vision and serve God as a Parish. ## Milton Food Bank



The Milton Food Bank is in need of volunteers. It is located at the Hand Up Foundation and is open from 9-3 on the 1st and 2nd Wednesday of each month. Volunteers are needed to sign people in at the registration table, pack bags of groceries, fill the carts, pack fresh produce, breads, and freezer foods. At the end of the day volunteers may also help to tear down boxes for recycling, sweep, and reorganize the food for the next time. On the Tuesday before the food bank, volunteers are needed to

help stock shelves with the incoming donated food and start to pack food boxes for distribution the next day. Two to three volunteers are needed at one time and you may split the day into shifts if you can only help out for a few hours. The goal for the Parish Stewardship team is to have enough volunteers to help the food bank one day per month. This is a great way to live out God's Work, Our Hands in our community. ## Upper Susquehanna Synod News

#### IT'S TIME FOR THINKING CAPS AND BRIGHT IDEAS!

For over a year now, the Upper Susquehanna Synod has been considering mission and ministry within the synod. It began with a discussion of how the synod is currently perceived, as well as what the congregations feel they need from the synod. At last year's Assembly, roundtable conversations provided facilitators with information from which goals were developed. This year's Assembly took things a step further by defining and discussing three areas of focus through which our congregations can develop relationships among their members. These areas of focus include:

**Church/Unity** – We are Church; We are Church Together; We are Lutheran; We are Church for the sake of the world. We are *only, holy, catholic and apostolic* Church. How will we be church and enhance our unity?

**Support/Presence** – We are a church in relationship with God, each other, our church partners, and the world. How can we deepen these relationships?

**Discipleship/Leadership** – We are a church called to lead others to the profound grace of Jesus. How do we recognize leaders in our congregations and beyond?


The discussions of the Areas of Focus took place by conference. The Buffalo Valley Conference had a great brainstorming session and many good ideas were put forth such as implementing a conference newsletter, joint worship services (e.g., Ascension Day), pulpit exchanges, and shared youth group activities among many others.


