Dear Friends of the Milton Lutheran Church,

This past month we finished our worship series 'Listen God is Calling'. We spent several weeks as a faith community being reminded of the ways that God speaks to us as individuals and as a church. Our last week of the worship series we focus on how God speaks to us specifically as a church and explored one of Paul's letters in the bible, Ephesians 4: 1-16. In his letter to the people of Ephesus Paul outlines four characteristics that we should embody as the body of Christ to remain in unity with one another as we discern God's will for us.

4 As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. ²Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. ³Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. ⁴There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; ⁵ one Lord, one faith, one baptism; ⁶ one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

⁷But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it. ⁸This is why it^[a] says:

"When he ascended on high,

- he took many captives
- and gave gifts to his people."[b]

⁹ (What does "he ascended" mean except that he also descended to the lower, earthly regions^[]? ¹⁰ He who descended is the very one who ascended higher than all the heavens, in order to fill the whole universe.) ¹¹ So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, ¹² to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up ¹³ until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

¹⁴ Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming. ¹⁵ Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. ¹⁶ From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.

These four characteristics Humbleness, Gentleness, Patience, and Bearing One Another in Love can be difficult things to embody, but ultimately Paul outlines them as a way to help us live together in community unified with God.

Humbleness- This characteristic reminds us that we are all created equal in the eyes of God. Each of us brings different perspectives and ideas. As a church our challenge is to listen to one another and recognize that our

perspectives and ideas are not the only ones out there. With humbleness we share our opinions and seek to listen to the opinions of others.

Gentleness- This characteristic reminds us that we all have baggage. I like to think of the church as a hospital for people looking to heal their spirits. It's important that we give space to one another to learn and grow. Some changes or decisions we make may be easy for some but hard for others. God calls us to be gentle with one another when we disagree and are struggling.

Patience- There are times when discerning God's will for us individually can take a long time to figure out. Some changes in our lives can take months or even years to take shape. As a church we all called to embody the characteristic of patience and recognize that it can take a long time for us to collectively discern what God's will is for our community of faith.

Bearing One Another With Love- The greatest commandment is to love one another as God has loved us. The Greek word for love is 'Agape'. It literally translates into sacrificial love. Bearing one another with love means being willing to sacrifice our own wants, needs and desires for those of our neighbors. It challenges us to consider what we are willing to place aside so we can love those we are in relationship with.

As we enter another season in the life of our congregation and begin the formal process of discernment my prayer for all of us is that we will be intentional to embody these characteristics as a church in the best way we know how. Inevitably we will fail, but through open communication, dialogue, and a commitment to God we too can live into God's call to be the body of Christ.

An Update from MLC Church Council

From Council President Lynnette Weisner

Council news

The MLC council met on May 20, 2024. Sue Ellen Spotts, the Director of Evangelism and Mission for the synod, met with the council to help us formulate interview questions to be used when the council interviews potential consultants to help us with the strategic planning process.

Thus far we have two proposals and hope to seek a third option before we begin the interview process. As volunteers we do not have the expertise to do this ourselves. We want to do the best job possible with the strategic planning process and thus need the help of experts who have experience working with congregations as they undertake this type of process. There will likely be a significant cost to hire a consultant and depending upon the cost, it may require a special congregational meeting to approve it. The council will keep the cost in mind when choosing the best consultant to work with us.

The council also discussed the plan for June 9th when we list the strengths, challenges, and opportunities of the building at 1125 Mahoning St. Christopher Coup and Lynnette Weisner will lead this discussion and the responses will be recorded. This is the same process that we used last year while at 100 Mahoning St. These responses will be utilized in the strategic planning process. Sue Ellen Spotts will then explain more information about the discernment/strategic planning process, what it entails, and the time frame to do this correctly.

The property team is finalizing a building use policy that will be presented to the council hopefully next month for their review and approval. This policy would apply to anyone who would want to use our buildings for an event.

It was brought to our attention that the council had not communicated our policy decision about weddings and funerals at 100 Mahoning St. last year. In February of 2023 council decided to maintain the same policy for 100 Mahoning St as was already in place for 1125 Mahoning St with regard to weddings and funerals. That policy stated that if one was originally a member of 1125 Mahoning St., they could have a wedding or a funeral at that building if needed. Thus, if anyone who was originally a member at 100 Mahoning St. wanted to have a wedding or a funeral in that building, they could do so. It was our intent to communicate this policy at the March 2023 congregational meeting, but we neglected to do so. If there are any questions about this decision, please speak with a member of council.

Finally, this past month we spent time reflecting on the Ephesians 4:1-16 text from the final week of our 'Listen God is Calling' worship series. We discussed how to best embody the characteristics that Paul outlines in Ephesians: humility, gentleness, patience, and bearing one another with love. Together we made a commitment to work toward embodying these characteristics as your council and our hope is that each of you will as well.




