# Message from Parish Council

Parish Council and our combined Councils met August 12. We discussed the joint services held in July and August. We are pleased with the attendance so far and the congregation's willingness to try new worship opportunities. Our combined councils decided to continue our experiment into September and October with one small change--services will now be at 9 a.m. We wanted to try this new time to better suit those who missed the 8:30 service. September services will be at Christ and October services at Trinity.

Parish Council met August 13 with our new part-time interim pastor Deacon Gary Schaeffer. He is currently serving as part-time interim at St. Marks in Shamokin Dam and will continue in that role along with serving our Parish. He will begin September 1 and will work with our councils and committees, provide pastoral services such as hospital visits, lead some Wednesday afternoon services, and lead Sunday worship services once a month on the fourth Sunday of each month. Deacon Gary will be establishing regular office hours and will be starting weekly Bible studies. His first Sunday service with us will be 9 a.m. Sunday, September 22, at Christ.

# Milton Food Bank



The Milton Food Bank is in need of volunteers. It is located at the Hand Up Foundation and is open from 9-3 on the 1st and 2nd Wednesday of each month. Volunteers are needed to sign people in at the registration table, pack bags of groceries, fill the carts, pack fresh produce, breads, and freezer foods. At the end of the day volunteers may also help to tear down boxes for recycling, sweep, and reorganize the food for the next time. On the Tuesday before the food bank, volunteers are needed to

help stock shelves with the incoming donated food and start to pack food boxes for distribution the next day. Two to three volunteers are needed at one time and you may split the day into shifts if you can only help out for a few hours. The goal for the Parish Stewardship team is to have enough volunteers to help the food bank one day per month. This is a great way to live out God's Work, Our Hands in our community.
