James 1:19-27

¹⁹ My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, ²⁰ because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires. ²¹ Therefore, get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the word planted in you, which can save you.

²² Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. ²³ Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror ²⁴ and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. ²⁵ But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do.

²⁶ Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless. ²⁷ Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.

Have you ever looked in the mirror and not recognized yourself? I found myself doing this about 6 months ago. A lot has changed about my physical appearance over the past several months since my surgery. After 20 years of struggling with my weight, in recent months there are days when I look in the mirror and I'm not sure that I recognize the person who is looking back at me.

The author of James gives us a different way of looking into the mirror. He says "23 Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror 24 and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. 25 But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do." James invited us to look into the mirror of God who creates, redeems, and makes us holy. When we do this, we see a reflection of a person who is quick to listen and slow to speak, not controlled by anger, and see ourselves as someone who leads their lives in such a way that it honors God.

We are invited through our baptism to live out God's word, not just listen to it. We are freed by God's grace to live out our baptismal promises. We are encouraged to look into the mirror of God and experience grace, love, compassion, and mercy. And it's through this mirror of God that we are reminded of who we are and whose we are. In doing so we are empowered to be God's people who care for all of creation and everyone in it.

An Update from MLC Church Council

Council news

The MLC council met twice in August to discuss and decide upon the strategic planning proposal to present to the congregation. The council is recommending the proposal by Keith Johnson, The Board Coach. Keith will provide coaching for Pastor Gary throughout the strategic planning portion of the process, lead the strategic planning retreat, train the strategic planning and research teams, and meet with the pastor and the chairpersons twice a month. The facilities assessment portion of the process will be led by Keith. In addition to the strategic planning team, there will be a community research team and facilities assessment team. Congregation members will be included in this process via cottage meetings. From all this information, a strategic vision and goals will be established and voted on by the congregation. A detailed proposal has been made available to the congregation.

Congregation members are encouraged to attend one of the information meetings to learn more about why we need to engage in this process, to discuss any concerns, and answer any questions you may have. These meetings are scheduled for Sunday September 8th at 10:45 am after worship, Monday September 9th at 7 PM, and Tuesday September 10th at 10 AM. Members of council, the finance team, and Pastor will be present.

A special congregational meeting is scheduled for Sunday September 22nd after worship for the congregation to approve the strategic planning proposal and the 2024 revised budget. A letter has been sent to the congregation with copies of the 2024 revised budget and the strategic planning proposal, the dates for the information meetings, and the date of the special congregational meeting.

The council also discussed areas that Pastor can cut back on to free up more of his time to work on the strategic planning process. Likewise, the council also discussed possible activities for the congregation to cut back on to allow time needed for participation in the strategic planning process. Both areas will be reevaluated in December.

The council appointed John Martello, Leslie Yocum, and Linwood Hill to the audit team.

Fresh Express' 1 year anniversary is in September! It is a joy that our congregation has hosted this ministry for a year already.

Starting September 16th, we will be accepting orders for our Outreach Hoagie Sale. It will be \$6 for an 8 inch, regular, Italian sub (ham, salami, provolone, lettuce, tomato, option of onions, mayo, and oil packets). Orders will be accepted until September 30th and pick up of the hoagies will be on October 14th from 3:30-5:30pm at 1125 Mahoning St. Money must be turned in with the order.

Outreach would also like to share that our Self-Care Sanctuary for August was the busiest one ever! We had 49 shoppers that shopped for 109 people.

The 1st happy tails pet pantry was well received. We helped 30 shoppers that in turn helped feed 97 animals. The distribution center where we picked up 850 lbs. of pet food was most helpful in assisting us with loading. We had friends from Haven to Home Canine Rescue help us unload and sort 1250 cans of cat food and 540 cans of dog food.

The Outreach team helped United in Christ collect school supplies as well as distribute them at the open house being held at Baugher Elementary and White Deer. We received 206 folders, 4 notebooks, 68 glue sticks, 82 pencils, 43 packs of crayons, 22 packs of colored pencils, 6 packs of markers and 1 backpack for the back-to-school items collected for the Milton School district. Thank you to all who donated.

The team has placed a sign-up sheet out for donations and volunteers for the beignet stand for the Harvest Festival. We are mixing the dough on Friday September 13th and the stand will need volunteers to help serve and clean up on September 14th. Please consider helping!

The outreach and fellowship teams are currently working on planning our Trunk or Treat event that we will be holding at 1125 Mahoning St. on October 19th from 3-5pm. We are requesting volunteers who can help with food, games, directing people where to go for different parts of the event, and parking. 


Fidget Quilt is an event where we will gather to make small, lap quilts with fidgeting items on them for people who have Alzheimer's to keep their hands busy.

Grief group is starting back up again at the end of the month.



We also are asking for donations of candy for handing out.


If you can volunteer to run inside games for Trunk or Treat, the signup for that is also in the binder.
