As a community of faith, we have been challenged in finding new ways of staying connected with one another even though we are not able to meet in person. It feels bizarre to share with you that we are still not able to gather in person, especially as we enter Holy Week. With the Governor's orders to shelter in place this week, we will not be able to record worship services at the church like we hoped. However, we will still record videos from our home and make them available to you. This includes Sunday worship as well as Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. There is a devotional included with this letter that you can use at home.

Now, we come to Easter. It pains us to say that we will not be able to celebrate Easter, on Easter Sunday, in person. However, we will have an online Easter service on Easter Sunday. Also, when we can gather in person for worship, we will be celebrating Easter. With the Easter scripture passages, full liturgy, music and celebration. That day will indeed be a day of resurrection as we gather after being apart for so long. It will be a time of great thanksgiving and rejoicing. The order for Easter flowers was cancelled due to shipping and distribution issues. We have kept track of those of you who paid for flowers and will be making arrangements to refund your money soon.

Many of you have mentioned wanting to find ways to support people in need. Because of our limited ability to gather and the recommendations to stay home as much as possible. We want to encourage all of you to stay safe. Each day there are new opportunities to provide support to our community. Organizations are gathering food, people are sewing face masks for medical workers, and other organizations are doing what they can. If you find out about new opportunities to help, please don't hesitate to communicate those with us. Also, don't feel like you have to wait to help. It's okay to provide care without having to organize efforts. Just be sure to keep yourself and those around you safe.

And, a reminder about giving. As you know our parish relies on the giving of others in order to sustain its' ministry. We recognize that the Coronavirus has placed a financial strain on all of us. However, if you are able, please consider making your offering by mailing a check to either church office so we can continue to make payments toward the ongoing expenses.
