

- 1. The stewardship team would like to thank those who contributed to the children's clothing give away at the free community meal in June. We plan to offer the remaining clothing items at the August 11, 2019 meal as many children attend the August meal when we give away backpacks with school supplies.
- 2. In June, we will be collecting the following items for the August backpack give away: #2 pencils, mechanical pencils, colored pencils, pens, small pencil sharpeners, and ruled subject notebooks. In July, we will be collecting: crayons, markers, glue sticks, erasers, and ruled subject notebooks. Items can be placed in the box in the narthex at Trinity or Christ.
- 3. A fresh food pantry to supplement the non-perishable food provided by the Milton Food Bank at Hand Up was proposed by Claire Weisner, as her college honors project, and was approved by the council. The Milton Food Bank has started a Fresh Food Initiative and is in need of help to meet those needs.

Claire will be working with the food bank and the parish stewardship team to form relationships with local

grocers and butchers for fresh food donations. To increase the number of volunteers to help with food distribution between 9 AM and 3 PM on the first and second Wednesday of each month, members of the National Honor Society and Student Government at Milton Area High School, other community organizations/churches, and members of Milton Lutheran Parish will be asked to help with food sorting and distribution.

A future goal is the creation of a church garden to provide fresh vegetables for the food bank. The longer term goal would be having a greenhouse for yearlong production of fresh vegetables that would be built by the building trades students at the high school and managed by the FFA members. If we would be awarded an ELCA Domestic Hunger grant, for which an application has been submitted, it would be used for this purpose. The final step would be to partner with another organization to offer recipes and cooking classes to teach people how to prepare healthy, easy recipes using the fresh food.

4. Plans are underway for a picnic meal for residents at the Towers, Centre Town Apartments, and Mahoning Acres on God's Work, Our Hands Sunday, September 8, 2019. Once again we will be building a parish float for the Milton Harvest Festival Parade on September 21, 2019. More details will follow in the August newsletter.

SYNOD ASSEMBLY JUNE 14-15,2019

The 32nd annual assembly of the Upper Susquehanna Synod was held on June 14-15, 2019 at Susquehanna University. Pastor Mark, Lynnette Weisner, Rick Coup, Mindy Bartholomew, Donna Spear, and Rich Handy served as our delegates. In addition to the business components on the first day, these are a few of the things we learned about: opportunities for advocacy (Lutheran Advocacy in Ministry in Pa.), mission trips and disaster relief in a partnership between the Upper Susquehanna Synod and the Northumberland Presbytery, interfaith worship through LARC (Lutheran, Anglican, and Roman Catholic), and the Christmas at Sea gift bags for the Seafarers International House. Our synod alone gave 670 gift bags last year, which was one fourth of the total bags disseminated to merchant marines who could not be home with their families for Christmas!

On day 2 we broke into conferences to discuss what we as a conference (ours is the Buffalo Valley Conference made up of churches in Union and Upper Northumberland counties) could do together to implement the synod's strategic mission plan, the resources needed, and what each of us could do to make the plan successful. As we learned about many wonderful outreach programs by other conference congregations, we identified the need to have better communication between congregations within our conference to share this information;

the need for more inter-congregation activities to build relationships, to promote Lutheran unity, and support our ministries; and to better identify and develop leaders in our congregations. Various ideas were discussed such as a conference newsletter and establishing regular meetings for lay members of the 15 congregations to meet to organize and plan activities within the conference. Some examples of activities were making Christmas at Sea gift bags, a pulpit exchange, a parishioner exchange where several members would worship in one another's congregations on selected Sundays. If you would like to be a part of the first lay person grassroots planning process for the Buffalo Valley Conference, please join us on Sunday, August 25, 2019 at 6 PM at United in Christ, West Milton (the Twin churches).

Stewardship of our civic freedoms

As Americans celebrate the birthday of our nation, we give thanks for our civic freedoms of speech, religion, assembly, due process, a speedy trial, voting and many more. Our freedom has made us the envy of much of the world. But as with any valuable gift, our civic freedoms can be abused, neglected or underappreciated to the point where, if we aren't careful, they hardly matter anymore.

Lutherans are guided by Martin Luther's insight that we are simultaneously called to be responsible citizens of "two kingdoms" – first, of God's spiritual realm, and second, of earthly governments of people and laws. The synergy of our "dual citizenship" directs us to be good stewards of our civic freedoms.

Freedom of speech: Yes, even hateful speech and lies are protected under our Constitution, but Christians avoid them in obedience to Jesus' command to love our neighbor as ourselves and by the Eighth Commandment, which Luther explains in *The Small Catechism:* "We should fear and love God, so that we do not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations." We steward this freedom by speaking honestly and insisting others do, too.

Freedom of religion: Millions of people across the globe,


including Christians, face persecution and discrimination because of their faith. We dare not take our freedom for granted, but exercise it with joy and defend the rights of others to follow their own consciences.

Freedom from illegal prosecution: Our guarantees of due process in legal, criminal and civil proceedings uphold justice and guard against government misconduct. It works imperfectly, as do all human systems, but as good stewards we fight for justice and the rights for all.

Freedom of self-governance: With its interconnected checks and balances, our three-branch system of government provides stability, accountability and flexibility for change. It's a great system, but it requires us to be informed and involved. We steward this freedom by participating in political processes, voting and insisting on honest government that works for our interests.

This month, as citizens of both God's spiritual realm and the United States of America, we renew our commitment to be good stewards of the freedoms we are privileged to have.
