A Letter from the Pastor

2 Timothy 1:1-14

When the apostle Paul wrote his second letter to Timothy, he was nearing the end of his earthly journey. Imprisoned and facing death, Paul's words carry a special urgency. He is passing the torch to Timothy, encouraging him to hold fast to the faith and continue the mission of sharing the good news of Jesus Christ.

Paul reminds Timothy of his spiritual heritage—the sincere faith of his grandmother Lois and his mother Eunice. Their witness shaped Timothy, giving him a foundation of faith that Paul urges him to carry forward. We, too, are heirs of a faith that has been handed down to us. Parents, grandparents, mentors, pastors, Sunday school teachers—all have played a role in passing along the gift of God's Word and the hope of the Gospel.

He reminds us that faith is not something to be kept quietly on a shelf. It is a living gift that must be nurtured, strengthened, and shared. His encouragement to Timothy is the same encouragement for us today: "Fan into flame the gift of God" (v. 6).

So what does that look like in our daily lives as a congregation? Here are some concrete ways we can live out Paul's words together:

1. Remember and give thanks for those who passed faith to you.

Just as Timothy was shaped by the witness of his grandmother Lois and mother Eunice, we are called to honor those who have nurtured our faith. Take a moment this week to thank someone who has encouraged you in your walk with Christ—or reach out to someone younger in faith and be that encouragement for them.

2. Keep the fire of faith burning.

Fires need tending, and so does our spiritual life. Worship, prayer, and Scripture study aren't just good habits—they are how we keep faith alive. Join in Sunday worship, commit to regular prayer time, and consider taking part in a small group or Bible study this fall.

3. Live with courage, love, and self-control.

Paul reminds us that "God did not give us a spirit of fear, but of power, love, and self-discipline" (v. 7). That means showing courage in speaking about your faith, practicing love in your relationships and service, and exercising self-control in choices that reflect Christ's way.

4. Guard the treasure of the Gospel.

Guarding the Good News doesn't mean keeping it locked away—it means protecting its truth by living it out.

We are called to hold fast to the hope of Jesus, to resist messages that distort the Gospel, and to share it faithfully with our neighbors.

As a congregation, let's take these steps together. Let us fan into flame the gift of God within us so that the warmth of Christ's love spreads into our homes, our community, and beyond.


Outreach Team


