Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends of the Milton Lutheran Church

Last month we started our review of the book "Gone For Good- Negotiating the Coming Wave of Church Building Transition". In our first part of the summary, we talked about the history of churches in the United States and the current reality that many church buildings will be sold/repurposed over the next decade.

This month, I'd like to share some helpful information that the contributors of the book provide when considering what to do when you are facing the reality of needing to sell or repurpose a building.

As I mentioned last month, for a long time the church was the center of the community. It was a gathering place for many different groups of people throughout the week, in addition to Sunday morning. Although this is not our present-day reality, we need to recognize that selling or repurposing a church building can create a void in the community and have a lasting impact toward the people, groups, and organizations that have utilized the space.

It's important for us as a church to consider who uses the space, what it is currently being used for and what possible uses there may be in the future. As a church it's easy for us to talk about the impact of selling or repurposing one of our buildings has on us personally. It is equally important for us to consider the impact that it would have on the community around us. How would people respond if a building was torn down to build something new? How would people respond if a building ceased to exist as a place of worship?

The contributors mention in the book that these are unavoidable consequences of a difficult decision, but they encourage church communities to be mindful of this reality as they seek to make those decisions. They also encourage church communities to be proactive in communicating the decisions they've made, the reasons behind those decisions, and naming the difficult reality for people who live in the community around the building.

An Update from MLC Church Council

Council news

Council is moving forward with the rental of the sanctuary and 2 classrooms at 100 Mahoning Street to the Community Mennonite Church while their church is going through a construction process. It would start in August, and they hope to be back in their church by January. They would also pay custodial fees along with their rent.

The Raised Garden Beds for Getting Ahead are being led by Bethany Soromski from the Venturing Scout Program. Council approved her proposal that she presented after a review from the property team. It will consist of 4 48x24in raised boxes. The scouts will be responsible for taking care of the boxes and the area around them. They will be assembled by Venturing Crew 2605, one of the three Scouting America chartered by Milton Lutheran Church.

The Strategic Planning committee is planning to meet with the participants in the cottage meetings who signed up to help establish objectives for the goals. This is scheduled for May 16th and 17th. At the next council meeting, May 19th, Council will meet with the Strategic planning teams along with the facilities team, to develop a recommendation to be presented to the congregation. There will be at least 2 cottage meetings to discuss the recommendation.

Council passed the Rules of Procedure for the June 29th congregational meeting. These procedures will be mailed to the congregation before the June 29th meeting.

Where are We in the Strategic Planning Process?

Cottage Meetings were held during the week of April 6th through 10th with a total of 49 participants. Two meetings were held at 1125 Mahoning Street and the other four sessions were in facilitator's homes. Strategic Planning Team members conducted the meetings assisted by council and congregation members. Each participant received Cottage Meeting packets prior to the meetings and were encouraged to thoughtfully process the information. This included: MLC's vision, goals, and facilities assessment. The information was reviewed and discussed at each meeting. At the conclusion of the meetings, participants were given a questionnaire to complete which was returned to their facilitator or to the church office.

On April 23rd the SP Team held a Zoom meeting with Pastor Gary and our consultant Keith Johnson. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the feedback gathered at the Cottage Meetings. This information was taken from 44 questionnaires and summarized by Keith. The summary reflected the open dialogue of the meetings.

As chairperson of this team, I would like to express my gratitude to all those who helped facilitate the meetings and to those who participated. Thank you everyone!


both were roaring with all the rain they had up north on Friday and Friday night. On the way home we stopped at D&D Brew Works near Laport for refreshments.

All orders can be placed through a special website that will be sent out in a special communication on Monday.


Orders MUST be placed by May 10th. The store will close and will not take any more orders as the company needs time to print them and ship them. They can be picked up at the church on June 1st.
