OVERVIEW

- > **Be able to access and read a safety data sheet (SDS) and answer questions about a chemical's properties and emergency response factors.**
- > **Talk through several scenarios and demonstrate the ability to determine evacuation or shelter-in-place criteria, how to communicate with the property authorities, determining emergency response actions, and overall incident management.**
- > **Demonstrate understanding of all elements of CFR 1910.120 and other relevant OSHA, EPA, and other regulatory standards as required.**


