

NOTICE is hereby given that a public hearing will be held by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Avoca, New York in the Town rooms of the Masonic Temple in such Village on the 24 day of August, 1952 at 8:00 o'clock P. M., Daylight Saving Time, upon the question of the enactment of the following ordinance in the matter of the government of the said village, to wit:

ORDINANCE OF VILLAGE ESTABLISHING
CURFEW FOR CHILDREN UNDER SIXTEEN
YEARS OF AGE.

RESOLVED, AND BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Avoca, New York, as follows:

It shall be unlawful for any person actually or apparently under the age of sixteen years to be or remain in or upon any of the streets, alleys or public places in the Village of Avoca, New York, at night, after the hour of ten o'clock P. M., unless such person is accompanied by a parent, Guardian or other person having the legal custody of such minor person or is in the performance of an errand or duly directed by said parent, guardian or other person having the care and custody of such minor person or whose employment makes it necessary to be upon said streets, alleys or public places during the night time after said specified hour. Provided that this exception shall not apply when the person under age shall be playing or unnecessarily loitering in or upon such street, alley or public place, whether alone or accompanied by a parent, guardian or any person or persons whatever.

It shall be unlawful for any parent, guardian or any other person having the legal care and custody of any person under sixteen years of age, to allow or permit any such child, ward or other person under such age, while in such legal custody, to go or be in or upon any of the streets, alleys or public places in the Village of Avoca, within the time prohibited in the foregoing paragraph of this ordinance, unless a reasonable necessity exists therefor.


The police officers of the Village of Avoca are hereby authorized to arrest, without a warrant, any person wilfully violating the provisions of the foregoing two paragraphs and detain such person for a reasonable time in which complaint can be made and a warrant issued.

No such parent or minor person arrested under the provisions of this ordinance shall be placed in confinement until the parents or guardian of such persons shall have been notified and shall have refused to be held responsible for the observation of the provisions of this ordinance.

Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be and is hereby declared a disorderly person and any violations of the provisions of this ordinance shall subject the offending party to a penalty of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each offense and in addition to such penalty, the said violation shall constitute disorderly conduct.

This ordinance shall take effect ten days after the publication and posting of the same as provided by Section 95 of the Village law of the State of New York.
