Pastor's Reflection: First Sunday of Advent 2025

While the gospel for this First Sunday of Advent clearly states that we must always be prepared, the second reading from Romans 13:11-14 gives us a basic **recipe for readiness.** We can distinguish five fundamental instructions in Paul's recipe.

Wake up – The text says, ... you know the time; it is the hour now for you to awake from sleep... This text, which tells us to wake up, refers to the moral and mindful sense of sleep. St. Paul insists we must be morally awake and responsible for our actions: Do not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may prove what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect (Rom 12:2).

Clean up – The text says, ... not in orgies ... not in promiscuity and lust ... and make no provision for the desires of the flesh. The emphasis in this passage is on sexuality because the pagan world at the time of Paul was sexually confused and immature. Promiscuity, adultery, fornication, homosexual activity, divorce, abortion, and infanticide were all rampant. Sound familiar? By telling us it is time to clean up, God is not out to limit our fun; He is trying to protect us. He is also trying to protect marriage and children.

Sober up – The text says, ... not in drunkenness ... Physically, to be drunk means to have our mind confused due to the influence of alcohol. Conversely, to be sober is to have a clear mind that can make sound judgments. There are many crazy, and just plain wrong notions today that emerge from the haze of unsound thinking and a drunken and confused world: Be sober, be watchful. Your adversary, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. Resist him, solid in your faith (1 Peter 5:8).

Lighten up – The text says, ... not in rivalry and jealousy ... An awful lot of our sins revolve around our sensitive egos. In Galatians, Paul warns of other things that flow from this source: enmity, strife, anger, selfishness, dissension, factions, and envy (Gal 5:20). Our biggest sin is pride; along with all its minions: envy, jealousy, greed, hatred, fear, bitterness, a hard and unforgiving heart, and just plain old meanness. The Lord wants to give us a heart that is loving and open to others, a less egocentric heart.

Dress up – The text says, **But put on the Lord Jesus Christ** ... The moral life of the New Testament is not achieved; it is received. **St. Paul says, I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live** but Christ lives in me (Gal 2:20). Jesus says, I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. Apart from me, you can do nothing (John 15:5). If we really hope to wake up, clean up, sober up, and lighten up, it must be a work of His grace.

The Family Ministry at St. Anselm

Beloved St. Anselm Family,

Our Church and School Community is starting a new ministry focused on relationships and family health. This is in sync with my original pastoral plan, which continues to focus on the Eucharist as the fulfillment of all the sacraments, including the sacraments of healing (Anointing of the Sick, and Reconciliation). As we strive for the salvation of our souls, we will direct our efforts to enhance a fundamental unity of society: the family.

Our new family outreach ministry will be supported by *Communio*, a nonprofit ministry that trains and equips churches to share the Gospel through the renewal of healthy relationships, marriages, and the family.

This initiative is not exclusive to marriages or troubled families. It will help single men and women to establish healthy dating habits and discern when to consider marriage. Those preparing to be married will work with mentors before and after their wedding. Married couples will learn skills to strengthen their relationship. Couples facing challenges will have access to coaching resources to help them get back on track.

Early next month, we will administer a short, anonymous survey developed by Harvard's Human Flourishing Program to better understand and appreciate our parish family's marriage, family, and relationship needs. The results of this effort will be to highlight our Church and School community's strengths as well as identify areas for encouragement and support.
