## Pastor's Reflection: Feast of the Holy Family 2025

We celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family just five days after celebrating Jesus' birth. Oddly, we read a Gospel in which He is 12 years old. And then, next week, we have the Feast of Epiphany, during which Jesus is once again an infant. Nevertheless, here we are. Perhaps it is a good time to reflect on family life, as families often gather during the Christmas season. Moreover, as a Parish, we are embracing a Ministry Focus on Relationship and Marriage Health. Let us consider family and marriage along three lines: structure, struggles, and strategy.

**I. Structure** – All through the readings for today's Mass, we are instructed on the basic form, the basic structure of the family: a man who loves his wife and a woman who loves her husband. Within this stable, lasting, and faithful union of mutual support and love, they conceive and raise their children in the holy fear of the Lord (Sirach 3:2; Psalm 128:3; Colossians 3:20 21; Luke 2:45, 51; Luke 2:51 52). Add to this the principal description of the book of Genesis, which describes how God sets forth marriage: *A man shall leave his father and mother, cling to his wife, and the two of them shall become one flesh* (Genesis 2:24). To this first couple, God gave the mandate, *Be fruitful and multiply* (Genesis 1:22). Thus, we have set forth biblically the basic structure of the family: Children both need and deserve the stable and lasting union of a father and a mother, the complementary influences of the two sexes. This is the best environment in which to raise and form children. To intentionally deprive a child of this environment is both unwise and unjust to children.

**II. Struggles** – Yet what should be obvious seems to be strangely absent from the minds of many. The rebellion of adults against the plan and order of God has caused endless grief and hardship and created a culture that is poisonous to the family, the dignity of the individual, and the proper raising and blessing of children. Instead of thinking of the good of children, we indulge our pleasures as adults and promote the lie that there is no necessary connection between children and sexual relations. Marriage is ordered to the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of children.

**III. Strategy** – We must unambiguously re-propose the wisdom of God's Word to our children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. Even if we have fallen short personally, we cannot hesitate to announce God's plan for sexuality, marriage, and family. Neither homosexual unions nor any such unions are an alternative to biblical marriage. To allow children to be subjected to such environments for the sake of political correctness does them a grave injustice. In God's vision of marriage, the needs of children far outweigh the preferences, "rights," and needs of adults. God has a plan, and it must be our strategy, our way out of our struggles and back to His structure for our families.

## **The Family Ministry at St. Anselm**

Beloved St. Anselm Family,

Our Church and School Community is starting a new ministry focused on relationships and family health. This is in sync with my original pastoral plan, which continues to focus on the Eucharist as the fulfillment of all the sacraments, including the sacraments of healing (Anointing of the Sick and Reconciliation). As we strive for the salvation of our souls, we will direct our efforts to enhance a fundamental unity of society: the family.

Our new family outreach ministry will be supported by *Communio*, a nonprofit ministry that trains and equips churches to share the Gospel through the renewal of healthy relationships, marriages, and the family.

This initiative is not exclusive to marriages or troubled families. It will help single men and women to establish healthy dating habits and discern when to consider marriage. Those preparing to be married will work with mentors before and after their wedding. Married couples will learn skills to strengthen their relationship. Couples facing challenges will have access to coaching resources to help them get back on track.

We recently administered a short, anonymous survey developed by Harvard's Human Flourishing Program to better understand and appreciate our parish family's marriage, family, and relationship needs. The results of this effort will highlight our Church and School community's strengths as well as identify areas for encouragement and support.
