

Father Gabriel's Reflection for the 2nd Sunday of Lent Yr B

Beloved Parish Family of St. Anselm,

If God is for us, who can be against us? (Rom 8:31).

Last Sunday, we reflected on the imagery of the dessert as well as God's covenant with Noah. Our first reading this Sunday concludes the cycle of narratives about God's covenant with Abraham (Gen 12-23), which unfolds from his call, with the promise to be the father of many nations, through the birth of a son (Isaac), to God's command to offer Isaac as a holocaust. As Abraham obliges, the Lord's messenger intervenes at the last moment; Isaac is spared, and the promise is renewed: "Because you acted as you did in not withholding from me your beloved son, I will bless you abundantly" (Gen 22:16-17).

In both Judaism and Christianity, Abraham is a paradigm of faith who "when tested was found loyal" (Sir 44:20), who "hoped against hope" (Rom 4:18), and who "by faith . . . when put to the test, offered up Isaac" because he believed in a God who could raise the dead (Heb 11:17-19). Also, in Jewish tradition, Isaac is transformed into a model of self-sacrifice who went willingly to his death, which Christians adopt for Jesus, "the Son of God," who "has loved me and given himself up for me" (Gal 2:20).

The temptation of Jesus in last Sunday's Gospel indicated that no matter how filled with the Spirit we may be, we are not immune from the temptations of the evil one as Jesus himself was tempted. This motif continues in today's first reading, portraying Abraham as a model of a lifelong journey of faith that was tested to the very end. Equally, we see the disciples in the Gospel, who, though intimate with Jesus, crumbled when faced with the mystery of the cross.

We all have moments of temptation and doubt, which demand ultimate self-surrender to God for us to experience victory and the glory of the resurrection. Thus, the narrative of the Transfiguration for us during Lent means that even after moments of transcendence and transformation, we must come back to earth, continue to hear the voice of Jesus, and follow him on the way to the cross. In the transfiguration, Jesus wanted to teach his apostles that "he had first to suffer, and so come to the glory of his resurrection."

In the remaining weeks of Lent, let us listen to Jesus with the assurances and hope of the resurrection, as did Abraham and Jesus, who believed, "All's well that ends well." Let us listen to him in his Word, contained in Sacred Scripture in the beautiful devotion of the Stations of the Cross every Friday. Let us listen to him in the Sacraments, especially in silent adoration of the before the Eucharist, and humble confession of our sins in reconciliation. Let us listen to him in the events of our lives, seeking to decipher the messages of Providence in them. Amen.
