Fr. Gabriel's Reflection-Ascension Sunday Yr B

Beloved Parish Family of St Anselm,

Happy Mother's Day to our beloved mothers!

During the era of great immigration to the United States, many men left their families in Europe (or South America, Africa, or Asia nowadays) to seek fortune in the new world. It was a long journey filled with uncertainty. Some of these stories had happy endings in which the economically successful man could send for his family and give them a happy life in the United States.

Jesus, in his Ascension, was leaving behind his disciples. However, his journey was for their good. Though His journey was through the doors of death, it would lead Him to the riches of everlasting life, which He would share with us. He went ahead to prepare a place for us, as did the man who left his family in Europe.

The Ascension of Our Lord (sometimes confused with the assumption of Mary – celebrated on August 15th) offers us a few lessons: **First**, the Ascension gives us an understanding of who Jesus is. Each Sunday at mass, we profess in the creed that Jesus rose from the dead and is now *seated at the Father's right hand*. Paul also tells us in today's second reading of Jesus seated at God's right hand. When Jesus entered the presence of his Father, He sat at his right hand, a symbol of equality with His Father. That is Catholic theology: Jesus is God from God, light from light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father.

Second, the Ascension gives us an understanding of our destiny. Jesus said to His apostles at the Last Supper: "I go to prepare a place for you, and then I will come again and take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also" (Jn 14:2-3). Our destiny is in heaven, where we shall live with God forever.

Third, The Ascension also gives us an understanding of our responsibilities. Jesus said to the apostles, "You will be my witnesses." They were, but many others in the world today need to know about Jesus. Who will proclaim the good news of God's love to them? You and I are to be those witnesses.

Today, Jesus' commission for the Apostles to travel to the ends of the earth, making disciples of all nations, seems a reality. Moreover, as in the Acts of the Apostles, persecution and even murder are the cost of faithful witness to the gospel, especially as people speak out on behalf of the poor and marginal, as is the case in many parts of Africa, the Communist world and indeed beyond, where Christians are in the minority.

The Ascension tells us that the Church must be a community on a mission guided by God's Spirit and confident of God's protection even amid suffering and death. Indeed, the mission is a summons for us Catholics to move to uncharted territory under the guidance of God's Spirit, with confidence in Jesus' words: *I am with you always, until the end of the age*.
