Fr. Gabriel's Reflection–11th Sunday Yr B

Beloved Parish Family of St Anselm,

In today's Gospel passage (cf. Mk 4:26-34), Jesus speaks to the crowd about the Kingdom of God and its growth dynamics by recounting two brief parables. In the first parable (cf. vv. 26-29), the Kingdom of God is compared to the *mysterious growth of the seed*, which is cast upon the ground and then sprouts, grows, and produces ears [of grain], independent of the care of the farmer who, when it is fully grown, sees to its harvest.

In essence, through Jesus' teaching and action, the Kingdom of God is proclaimed, has burst into the field of the world, and, like the seed, grows and develops by itself through its strength and according to humanly incomprehensible criteria. In its growth and development in history, it does not depend much on man's doing but is, above all, an expression of the power and goodness of God, of the strength of the Holy Spirit who brings forth Christian life in the People of God.

At times, history, with its events and protagonists, seems to go in the opposite direction of the design of the heavenly Father, who calls all His children to faith and trust in Him. However, we are called to live out these periods as seasons of trial, hope, and vigilant expectation of harvest. Indeed, yesterday, like today, the Kingdom of God mysteriously surprisingly grows in a world which is quite hostile, revealing the hidden power of the little seed and its victorious vitality. Within the folds of personal and social events, which sometimes seem to signal the failure of hope, it is essential to remain confident in God's subdued but powerful way of acting. For this reason, in moments of darkness and difficulty, we must not lose heart but remain anchored in faithfulness to God, to His ever-saving presence. Remember this: God always saves. He is the Savior.

In the second parable (cf. vv. 30-32), Jesus compares the Kingdom of God to a *mustard seed*. It is a tiny seed, yet it grows to become the greatest of all the plants in the garden: an unforeseeable, surprising growth. It is not easy for us to enter this logic of God's unforeseeable nature and accept it in our lives. However, today, the Lord exhorts us to an attitude of faith that exceeds all our plans, calculations, and predictions. God is always the God of surprises. It is an invitation to open ourselves more generously to God's plans, both on the personal level and on that of the community – our God never fails.

The message is clear: even though the Kingdom of God demands our collaboration, it is first and foremost a gift of the Lord, a grace that precedes man and his works. If our own small strength, apparently powerless in the face of the world's problems, is inserted in that of God it fears no obstacles because the Lord's victory is guaranteed, despite the difficulty, suffering and evil that we encounter. May the Virgin Mary, who, like "good soil", accepted the seed of the divine Word, strengthen within us this faith and this hope.

The 2025 Church Restoration Campaign

Dear Parishioners,

For over 115 years, we have gathered in St. Anselm Church to celebrate life events: Baptisms, First Communions, Reconciliations, Confirmations, Weddings, Funerals, and school activities. This beautiful facility now needs our assistance. As with all physical structures, our church requires considerable repairs and maintenance beyond the scope of the daily, monthly, and yearly projects.

Approximately 6 years ago our Finance Council invited a group of parishioners and professionals skilled in the areas of architecture, construction, and facility maintenance to evaluate the needs of our church structure. Due to Covid 19, we have been on hold for the past 4 years. The results of this study showed that there are significant repairs that should be addressed. The most critical repairs are: The bell tower and the bell tower concrete foundation; waterproofing paper behind the stucco throughout the church exterior walls which has disintegrated over multiple decades leading to excessive water damage and rot to the wood frame structure.

It is estimated that the total repairs will cost approximately \$3,500,000. We initiated the capital campaign over 5 years ago, typically called the "Silent Campaign". Covid-19 put a hold on all fundraising efforts. In 2021 a long-time parishioner passed away and donated \$1,000,000 to St. Anselm Church. As of June 2024, we have \$2,000,000 committed to the Restoration Campaign (57%) Our goal is to raise the balance which is \$1,500,000 (43%).

Our Catholic faith, this Church, and this Parish, require a commitment from each one of us. Giving money in the Sunday collection or electronically is indeed an obligation for the sustainability of our parish community. In humility, I ask each family to decide what their commitment will be. Can each of us seek to reallocate monies within our personal budgets to go towards St. Anselm's and its long-term sustainability?

You are a blessing to this faith community. The parish thanks you and needs your support.
