# Pastor's Reflection: Second Sunday of Advent 2025

The Second Sunday of Advent typically features the Ministry of St. John the Baptist, who prepared the people of his time for the coming of Jesus by summoning them to repentance and opening them to the fullness of the Kingdom of God. Like John the Baptist, the Church, which Christ founded, continues this mission: [the baptized] must profess before men the faith they have received from God through the Church and participate in the apostolic and missionary activity of the People of God. (CCC, 1270). The ministry of St. John the Baptist in today's Gospel provides four principles for prophets and all the Baptized who prepare:

I. Poise. The content of John's preaching is twofold. He first says, "Repent!" And then adds, "For the Kingdom of God is at hand." While the preacher and the prophet must speak frankly about sin and call people to repentance, they must also discuss the grace available to conquer that sin and the Good News that the Kingdom of Heaven is now open and accessible. St. John joyfully announced the in-breaking of the Kingdom of God and the coming of the Messiah, but he spoke of repentance as the door of access. Do we have this balance, or do we preach mercy without repentance?

II. Product – The text says, At that time Jerusalem, all Judea, and the whole region around the Jordan were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. Prophets seek to prepare people. To repent, to come to a new mind and heart by God's grace, is to be prepared. The central work of the prophet is to call people to repentance unto salvation. Good preaching produces repentance unto salvation. It may cause some to be mad or sad, but if it is a proper prophecy, it will produce a godly sorrow, and the anger gives way to gladness. The expected product of proper preaching: repentance unto salvation.

III. Purity – John the Baptist's preaching had purity because he had no fear of people's opinion and would not compromise the message based on his audience. He did not have the need to flatter others. Fear is a great enemy of powerful prophecies, for by it many remain silent when they should speak. The fear of what other people may think causes us to compromise the truth and even sin against it. This sort of fear must be eliminated if our prophecy is to have the purity necessary to reach its goal.

**IV. Person** – John's audience and disciples were fascinated by him and drawn by his charisma. But the more they sought to know about him, John spoke instead about Jesus. A genuine prophet's message has got to be about Jesus, about God's agenda, not his ideology. In the week ahead, let us take a moment to thank God for someone who brought us to Christ, remembering that we, too, are called to be John the Baptist for others.

# The Family Ministry at St. Anselm

Beloved St. Anselm Family,

Our Church and School community is starting a new ministry focused on relationships and family health. This is in sync with my original pastoral plan, which continues to focus on the Eucharist as the fulfillment of all the sacraments, including the sacraments of healing (Anointing of the Sick and Reconciliation). As we strive for the salvation of our souls, we will direct our efforts to enhance a fundamental unity of society: the family.

Our new family outreach ministry will be supported by *Communio*, a nonprofit ministry that trains and equips churches to share the Gospel through the renewal of healthy relationships, marriages, and the family.

This initiative is not exclusive to marriages or troubled families. It will help single men and women to establish healthy dating habits and discern when to consider marriage. Those preparing to be married will work with mentors before and after their wedding. Married couples will learn skills to strengthen their relationship. Couples facing challenges will have access to coaching resources to help them get back on track.

We are currently administering a short, anonymous survey developed by Harvard's Human Flourishing Program to better understand and appreciate our parish community's marriage, family, and relationship needs. The results of this effort will highlight our Church and School community's strengths as well as identify areas for encouragement and support.
