

### Dear Parishioners,

Bread of life is the theme that dominates the majority of Sundays in August. Jesus, who knew the human heart intimately, was aware that the people had come in search of him in order to satisfy their physical hungers. However, he was attempting to whet their appetite for the true bread from heaven, who gives life to the world. In the first of several similar statements, Jesus declares: "I am the Bread of Life".

Eventually we were able to celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation during the past week and if all has gone to plan Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup>, Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> and Friday 30<sup>th</sup> July were good experiences for the Confirmation children and worthwhile events for our parish. Now the children have been confirmed they have to work out in a few years' time, like the rest of us whether we are meant to take on the vocation of marriage or go in another direction such as to the religious life. No matter what happens, certain truths will exist for all of us in knowing that God calls each person into existence and creates each of us in His image. God then invites each person to grow in this likeness through participation in the life of Jesus Christ, God's Word incarnate. During this life God does not force us. The truth of freedom is realised in one's acceptance of God's Word in my life. This is one's baptismal vocation. However, each of us must live this vocation. Christ seeks to be born in our life through the Holy Spirit. And so, my baptismal vocation must become increasingly personal. It becomes increasingly personal through God's particular call in and through my life; and it becomes increasingly personal through my response to that call in Christ. I grow as a person to the degree I respond to God's Word in my life. My vocation whether to marriage or religious life or whatever is not just for me. If we follow that personal call, it becomes a witness to God's power in our world.

With the above in mind each year in August in Australia we celebrate 'National Vocations Awareness Week'. This week is an opportunity to pray for and to help young people discern their vocation from God.

Also, I would like to draw your attention to a number of items:

- If you have a child from grade 3-5 with a possible interest in altar serving whether male or female, please look at the item enclosed.
- Following on last week's bulletin if you are interested in leading the rosary after weekday Mass please come and see me.
- On Sunday August 8<sup>th</sup> we will be celebrating the Feast of Mary of the Cross MacKillop. Also, as 'St Joseph by the Sea' has a presentation on Mary MacKillop by our own parishioner Annmaree laccarino on Thursday August 19<sup>th</sup> from 7:30pm – 9pm it should be worth your consideration. It is called 'The Spirit of the West: Mary MacKillop and the sisters of St Joseph in the West of Melbourne.
- New Parishioners Lunch: This has now been listed for Sunday August 29th at 11:30am straight after the 10:30am Sunday Mass.
- Please be reminded that on August 7<sup>th</sup> /8<sup>th</sup> weekend for Refugee and Asylum Seeker Families to bring if you can Dried Food: healthy breakfast cereals, dried fruit, nuts, seeds, healthy snack food (for lunch boxes), spices, Tea (both black and green) and instant coffee. 


