FR. GREG'S TRAVEL DIARY

I expected my final leg of walking the 995 kilometres from Vezelay to St. Jean Pied de Port to be a long day of walking but without too many hassles! However, trouble was waiting just around the corner. Due to the higher hills near the Pyrenees Mountains, most choose to only go about 20-25 kilometres that last day, but I thought I could achieve the 33 kilometres from Saint-Palais to the French/Spanish border at St. Jean Pied de Port. An added incentive was that there were two other strong walkers about 20 years younger than me staying at Saint-Palais as their last base to finish their own long distance walking. One had come from an even longer route than myself. I decided to go off early and hopefully give them a run for their money that last day. But, pride often follows a fall! Although I had asked for directions the previous evening, the direction was not completely clear and some older signage had not been replaced by newer signage. I headed off in the half dark and followed what turned out to be older signage, yet I made some very good headway, travelling five kilometres up hill in just over an hour. Nevertheless, I felt a bit confused at one point but seemed to be going towards my objective, until I came across a highway and could not work out if I was needing to go left or right, as normally the pilgrimage routes avoided major roads. Anyway, I noticed two ladies talking to each other inside a garage nearby. They both informed me that I had taken a variant of the old route and the only way to reach my objective was to completely retrace my steps! I left at 7:10am and I was back in the same town, Saint-Palais just before 10am!! Luckily, energy came my way as always was the case under greater difficulties during this longer than monthly walk. No doubt my prayers to God, and my favourite saints gave me strength and peace of mind. Along the right path some kilometres later and up a steeper hill I came across 24 Belgium walkers. As a walking group, they have walked part of a pilgrimage route every year. They were very friendly to the lone Australian, if not a bit curious. One told me that a special Belgian beer was waiting for me at the next town and that it was his shout! Fortunately or unfortunately, I needed to keep walking faster than this group and I never saw them again. Around lunchtime, I came into a town called Ostabat about 22 kilometres from my final destination and I remember it distinctly as I had accommodation lined up one kilometre past that town nine years before, when I walked the 800 kilometre Le Puy en Velay route. That last time I had walked about 40 kilometres and was just really hankering to get an evening meal and some sleep. However, I came across two very vicious dogs and felt very thankful to get past them as they were not chained or behind a fence. Lo and behold, nine years later there were two aggressive dogs in Ostabat as I walked through there and I was thinking these must be the son or daughter of those same nasty beasts! Somehow I was able to maintain my pace and I got into St. Jean Pied de Port at 6.20pm after probably 10 1/2 hours taken up by the walking and some more than difficult hills. There I was thinking I could achieve the 33 kilometres but through my own stupidity it ended up being 43 kilometres! One of the original walkers I had tried to beat told me later that he only arrived just an hour before me! I was able to raise my hands in triumph as I marched through the UNESCO HERITAGE GATES of St. Jean Pied de Port. Tired but not defeated! 995 kilometres later....I made conversation with this lovely couple next to my dinner table that night and they asked me to join them. This was not an untypical day of the trip - some real difficulties, but people, especially the French country people being more than lovely to you with their hospitality and often a needed sensitivity to an Australian man who sometimes was out of his depth or had nearly gone a bridge too far. We all need some kindness and hospitality!
