



Binh Le (pronounced "Bin") a warm welcome. Fr. Binh has a degree in Canon Law which also helps him help the Church at the Marriage Tribunal of the Melbourne Archdiocese.



Starting next weekend at the 8:30am Mass there will be Children's Liturgy every Sunday during Term 4. Thanks to the following who have volunteered and have Working with Children's Checks:

On all these dates there will be two adults present who hold current Working with Children checks in order to provide and follow proper safeguarding standards. Children's Liturgy will also provide some good religious education for the children of our parish in a safe environment.

I have no doubt future generations will applaud the work of Pope Francis as he tries to bridge the gaps that sometimes can exist within the church so that we may be as he has desired a more synodal church or in other words dialogue is encouraged not discouraged between all sectors.



With the above in mind, it is handy to know about the importance of the Roman Curia in the running of the Catholic Church as Pope Francis tries to re-organise it. Basically the Roman Curia is the bureaucracy that assists the Pope in his responsibilities of governing the universal church. The Curia is organised into offices of various ranks and importance. Chief among them is the Secretariat of State, which not only deals with diplomatic relations with various countries, but also is in charge of the overall supervision of the

other departments (known as dicasteries) of the Roman Curia. Anyway, without further ado it is worth noting that the Pope is reforming the Dicasteries - the major change in practice is at the level of governance. The new document promulgated on dicasteries on March 19th, 2022 means that any qualified Catholic can head a dicastery which is a radical change from the tradition that dicasteries are headed by ordained clergy, typically bishops and cardinals. In this, Pope Francis is embodying Vatican II's vision of church as the people of God where all the baptised are responsible in ministry. Pope Francis stated recently that in the future he sees the possibility of lay people being appointed to

lead certain Vatican departments such as the Dicastery of the Laity, Family and Life, the Dicastery for Culture and Education, or the Vatican Apostolic Library. In all this it is worth noting that Pope Francis recently named three women to the office that helps select bishops around the world. As we stated over the pulpit recently: 'from little steps big steps grow'.
