FR. GREG'S TRAVEL DIARY

No doubt the Columbans of North Essendon/Strathmore will thankfully be supplying for me until I celebrate Mass again on around 30th November (if that is the right date of a Saturday night). Wednesday 2nd October after walking through biggest pine forest in France (and Western Europe) to previous destination of Roquefort I headed for a rather large French town of Mont-de-Marsan. The rain came and went all day as I headed 28 km into the distance. It was really beautiful and awe inspiring to see the thousands of ferns at the foot of those reasonably large pine trees. The pine trees were often surrounded on their trunks by vines. I fortunately met my German friend Huggey Firez - the marathon man -as he had stopped to eat. We walked well together again and finished the last 12 km at a good steady pace. I then had time to go to another laundrette and while waiting for the clothes cycle to finish I went to buy toothpaste. I had bought some previous stuff a few weeks before that sounded and spelt like "tooth paste" in French, but it had a strange taste and still until today I do not know what I was using if it was not 'tooth paste'! Anyway, I felt sorrow for the very young girl at the Pharmacy as she did not have a clue what I meant when I signalled with a brushing motion over the teeth area what I had intention of trying to buy!

I had to ring beforehand if I wanted to eat with the family of the next night and I am glad that I did. It was such a beautiful meal provided with 3 French courses and some real nice wine. I had only 22km to go that next day to the quite big town also of Saint Sever. On the walking day of October 3rd there were simply hundreds of hectares of very wild blackberry bushes growing very close to another wonderful French river called the L'adour. I thought that only an escaped convict would want to walk through terrain off the small side track as no one would want to follow him or her. They would have been bleeding from head to foot with those incredibly sharp blackberry thorns - as bad as wild roses. Anyway, as I was two hours early for accommodation I decided to stop at a small bar/restaurant to drink some light beer. Thankfully another good walking friend, Yop the recently retired school teacher Dutchman was pleased to see me and we shared a lot of laughs together over a small drinking session. We were laughing so much that the next table of people, a middle aged couple, tried to listen to our conservation and they started laughing uproarsly. Yop and I were pleased that they were so happy and enjoyed at a short distance our company so much!

I love being an Australian as we appear to be more light hearted than many of the races of Europe. Of course they have often had harder times but the Australian nation is lucky to enjoy what God gave us all the opportunity to enjoy - "humour and a good laugh".





PASTORAL WORKER—St. Mary's - Williamstown Parish—PART-TIME

St. Mary's Williamstown would be an excellent choice for a person wanting to be an important part of an already dynamic Christian Community. Accordingly, we are seeking a suitably qualified person for this role commencing 1st February, 2020. This is a part-time position, two days per week, but also entails being present for a weekend Liturgy, with the requirement for additional hours during the Christmas, Easter and Confirmation periods. The normal 20 hours per week may be extended by mutual agreement. The successful applicant will work with the Parish Priest, and with the administration staff of the parish, as well as liaising with the school staff, particularly the RE Coordinator. We want an applicant who believes in moving our parish along a 21st century model, keeping in mind the principles of Vatican II. The remuneration will be in accordance with a Pastoral Worker position but is dependant upon the qualifications of the applicant. The position involves:
