
GOSPEL: MARK 1:29-39

On leaving the synagogue he entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them.

When it was evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various

diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew him.

Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon and those who were with him pursed him and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." He told them, "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come." So he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons throughout the whole of Galilee.

Dear Parishioners.

We welcome back everyone who had taken time off at Christmas, to visit relatives and friends and take a well-earned break from the hectic pace of life. Although some priests have a slower pace of life, I usually find January quite busy with several weddings, funerals and a whole pile of baptisms mounting up. I have had my finger in a few pies that also take up my time in January such as being the main organiser as secretary of the Melbourne Clergy Golf Tournament and the much headier work as the Chair of the Australian Catholic Clergy Remuneration Assistance Fund for the last seven years. Our committee raises money from priests in Australia to send to priests who live in outback areas such as Broome diocese and have very little means of receiving a reasonable stipend. As it has been full on, I am hoping to take time off during this week to refresh myself for what should be another good but challenging year.

PETITION FOR GAZA:

There are a lot of very worried people in our Parish as well as many representatives of their countries in the United Nations on the continued atrocities in Gaza. Even the International Court of Justice in the last week was not too complementary of Israel's present stand. The International Court of Justice ordered Israel to take six provisional measures to prevent acts of genocide. From my personal perspective to say it is an 'overkill' is to put it mildly by the present stance of the Israel government. I have no doubt many of their more sensible citizens are expressing strong



anger and disappointment with how brutal the retaliation has been on the Palestine people including the many women and children suffering from food shortages and lack of water. Accordingly, **one of our parishioners wanted me to put out a petition to sign down the back to send to the Hobsons Bay Council** as so many other metropolitan Councils have expressed the need for Israel to stop their present stand and seek more intelligent dialogue again. **Mainly the petition is calling for an immediate and permanent ceasefire** including condemning the present violence of Israelite forces against the people of Palestine. As a parish we wish the people of both Israel and Palestine to live in peace in as so far as that is possible in the decades to come and not to continue this violence which will only lead to more hatred and violence in the long term.

NEW PARISH STAFF MEMBER:

I have been very pleased to be able to add Sharon Vassallo to our Parish Staff at the beginning of January. The financial area is a very difficult and complex area these days for Parish secretaries. Consequently, Sharon is being eased into that arena with the background help of her husband Anthony who is a business manager of one of the bigger schools in the Western suburbs. Fortunately, Anthony applied for that position from Brisbane later last year and around the same time his wife saw the position of parish secretary being advertised for St Mary's Parish Williamstown, Victoria! Our panel thought that Sharon to be the best applicant, and I am glad to say that she is doing a fine and more than capable job after a month here. I think Sharon will be very good for our parish as well as her husband Anthony who is doing some serious theological studies on the side which one day may lead him to be a married deacon within the Catholic Church. This would mean he could help with marriages, funerals and baptisms within a given area. Married deacons are going to be worth their weight in gold over the next decade or two in the Melbourne Archdiocese.

"My name is Sharon Vassallo, and I am your new parish secretary. I was born in the UK and moved to Brisbane 17 years ago with my husband Anthony, and son Anton. At the end of last year, with Anton away at University, Anthony and I moved to Melbourne. We are delighted to have become members of the St Mary's parish and I look forward to serving our new community."

OTHER STAFF:

One of the other Staff members Kylie Skinner has worked here for the last 10 years and works a few hours as secretary on the Wednesday and completes the Parish Bulletin on the Wednesday morning after I send it completed by Tuesday night. Kylie and her husband Michael are well known in the Williamstown area and have two children in secondary school, Grace and Oliver. Kylie has been very loyal and reliable over many years. Just to refresh everyone's memory our other main staff member is Monique Julian who has been a Pastoral Associate for four years and took over from Sister Patricia. Monique works on a Monday and a Tuesday from her office in the presbytery. She coordinates the government school program and works closely hand in hand with our St Mary's Religious Education coordinator Charlotte Lipnicki.
