SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT — YEAR A

ADVENT

FIRST READING:

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah. 11:1-10

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Justice shall flourish in his time, and fullness of peace for ever.

SECOND READING:

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans. 15:4-9

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all people shall see the salvation of God.

GOSPEL: MATTHEW 3:1-12

In those days John the Baptist appeared, preaching in the desert of Judea and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" It was of him that the prophet Isaiah had spoken when he said:

"A voice of one crying out in the desert, 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths.'"

John wore clothing made of camel's hair and had a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. At that time Jerusalem, all Judea, and the whole region around the Jordan were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the Jordan River as they acknowledged their sins. When he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from



the coming wrath? Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance. And do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you, God can raise up children to Abraham from these stones. Even now the axe lies at the root of the tress. Therefore every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire. I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand. He will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

Dear Parishioners

Thanks for your efforts to "Staying Awake" and "Preparing the Way of the Lord" during this Advent Season. Accordingly, I hope those 90 booklets parishioners chose to take last weekend titled 'INCARNATE – Advent and Christmas Daily Reflections 2022' have proved helpful – I hope so. If others want a copy our pastoral associate Monique Julian has copied the appropriate pages from this weekend onward if anyone requests them from me after Mass today. As regards the 'INCARNATE' little booklet I loved that Caravaggio painting – although Caravaggio was somewhat of a scoundrel in his day he had a deep knowledge of human nature and could paint it so magnificently on canvas. In regards that particular painting I liked the way Monseigneur Graham Schmitzer challenges us from it to respond when Christ calls and not lose those opportunities. He further stated in a nicely



put way: 'While Christ's message reveals that we cannot be fully happy in this life, it also reveals that while we are within this world, we must be fully committed to it.we are to show the world that the following of Christ not only makes us more holy, but more human. Advent will give us plenty to think about if we seriously accept its message'.



Regarding the readings for this weekend: the reign of King David was the high point in the history of Israel – God's people. But his successors failed wretchedly. Still, the hope remained that a future king would succeed where his predecessors failed. Isaiah in the first reading foretells that even though the family tree of Jesse (David's father) has been reduced to a mere stump, nevertheless, from that stump a new shoot (a new king) will spring. He goes on to sketch a portrait of the true king. He will be filled with 'a spirit of wisdom and insight, a spirit of counsel and power, a spirit of knowledge..........'

Isaiah's vision corresponds to the deepest longings of the human heart, and points to God's ultimate goal for humanity. It is a blueprint of what can be achieved by the grace of God, given so lavishly in Christ. Then the Gospel writer Matthew portrays Jesus as the one who fulfills the Old Testament promises. Here he introduces us to John the Baptist and his mission. He has John preaching in the wilderness as Isaiah had foretold, and baptising with water in anticipation of the one who would baptise with the Holy Spirit.

DEACON TOM CHRISTIE

In case you were away last weekend newly ordained deacon Tom Christie will be moving on in late January. He has been assigned to my former parish of Grovedale/Torquay and Anglesea which has grown considerably since I left there 12 years ago. There are four Catholic schools in the parish now instead of two and several thousands of people have shifted into the Armstrong's Creek area between Grovedale and Torquay. There will no lack of baptisms for Tom to perform as well as funerals outside a Mass. He will be ordained a priest probably around midyear or maybe even a few months later and then he will be able to celebrate Masses and take Reconciliation Services as well as of course Marriage and Funeral (Requiem) Masses at some future assigned parish within the Melbourne Archdiocese. It is good that Tom can be with us for Christmas and the New Year as he has been with us all the year.
