



He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew him. Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon and those who were with him pursed him and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." He told them, "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come." So he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons throughout the whole of Galilee.

# Dear Parishioners,

Lent starts on Wednesday week. It can and should be a very fruitful experience, but for some they carry the wrong mindset into this opportunistic season. If you look at Lent as depriving you of some of your happiness or some of your pleasures then most probably you have already defeated the season of Lent before it even begins. Lent is rather an opportunity not to have more, but to be more. To be more compassionate or patient or kind - whatever - there



must be some basis though from the prayer time in Lent. I can give you 100 ways of praying but it is up to you to know how you pray, what distracts you from enhancing your prayer time, do I communicate better with set prayers or what helps me to be in better communication with the divine. Can I set a healthier pattern for that and stick to that without it seeming a burden? One cannot change oneself without being in touch with the Master. For instance, I cannot say practice 'patience' during Lent unless I receive wisdom from the Divine. To help that connection with God there will be a booklet available for \$10 which should be available from Ash Wednesday (Feb. 17th onwards) and it will give you a daily bible reading and some reflection opportunities. I think you will find it helpful.


Another aspect of Lent is that we need to understand: why we do the things we do. For example, in the early Church Lent began as a time of repentance for those preparing for baptism. Having experienced the call to follow Christ, those seeking to join the Christian Community made a commitment to turn away from sin and live a Christian life. They were baptised at the Easter Vigil. Today, the 6-week period of Lent is a time of repentance and renewal for the whole Church. It is a time when we prayerfully take stock of our lives, turn away from lifestyle habits that contradict the Gospel and renew our commitment to Christ and each other. By being marked with ashes on Ash Wednesday, a Catholic today is recognised by the community gathered as one who has chosen to repent of sin and believe in the good news.

A sign of our seriousness to take the season seriously is to start the ball rolling by "fasting". We only have one main meal and any others need to be lighter ones. However, in total perspective our first obligation is to fast from sin. Both Ash Wednesday are not only days we set aside for "fasting" but also the two particular days during the year that we abstain from meat.

May you enter the season with a good frame of mind and before even Lent starts reflect on not what you will give up or take on but rather how this will bring me closer in my relationship to God.




# Working Bee—Next Saturday 13th February 9.00am-11.00am
