Dear Parishioners and Visitors

There are numerous general things on my mind – many don't get a chance for the bulletin at a particular time – some I will remember – some I will forget – so please be in touch if I have forgotten to include something over the weeks that we should be highlighting. Consequently, I will just put a number of those things that come to mind in dot points:

- We had nearly 100 'Remember' booklets taken up by parishioners to help reflections for Lent. I would be interested to hear from parishioners on how you found the material. I thought the Artwork Spotlight added something extra this time to the Lenten reflections!
- The Pope came out in 2015 with "Laudato Si' an encyclical letter on ecology and climate. It is a
 really great encyclical, but it quite heavy going in places as the subject matter is not an easy one to
 completely appreciate. The Pope goes into depth on many of those issues. I have bought a few extra
 copies if anyone wants to take and read at any time.
- I thank those many people who offered their services over Easter, whether it was for reading, special minister, flowers, washing of the feet on Holy Thursday night etc.
- The Parish has registration forms on the table closest to the school at the back. Sometimes we do not have your details especially if you are a recent parishioners since the start of covid. Please take a sheet and put it in the presbytery letterbox or on the collection plate when it goes around next weekend. We appreciate new people feeling and being part of our Parish and Community.
- Thanks for the feedback from parishioners as they appreciated my part at the Anzac Day cenotaph program on that morning of April 25th.
- "Way of the West" continues to meet and tries to meet the needs of refugees and asylum seekers
 through a variety of avenues. For instance, recently we have been trying to look at helping another
 Ethiopian family to come from Ethiopia and support their loved ones who live in Williamstown who
 have need of specialised support through associated health problems.
- Do you know Fr Liam Ryan a chaplain at St John of God Midland Public Hospital in Western Australia?
 Well, along with two other rescuers he was recognised recently for displaying considerable bravery during the rescue of 28 year old surfer Phil Mummert, following a shark attack at Bunker Bay,
 Western Australia on July 31, 2020. He just happened to be surfing there with a friend close by at the time when the attack of a 5-metre white pointer took place. Luckily the shark got more of the surf board than the surfer in the end.
- The Pope continues to send messages of support for the Ukraine situation and does not beat around the bush about the need to stop this violence: "In the name of God, I ask: Stop this massacre".
- Although there are probably about 2,000 diocesan priests in Australia we are outnumbered by those in an abundance of religious orders (priests, brothers, sisters) all with their own charisms for teaching, hospital ministry whatever...Recently the Catholic Religious Association National Executive Director Anne Walker stated on behalf of the organisation: As the world moves closer to nuclear conflict, which will lead to humanitarian and ecological destruction on multiple levels and suffering for generations to come, we call for the non-proliferation of nuclear arms and a culture of peace between nations, peoples and the planet.....In response to the violence, death and devastation witnessed now in the Ukraine but also in countries around the world in the past few years, such as Afghanistan, Myanmar, and Ethiopia, we call upon our Catholic Community, and all people of goodwill, to pray and support refugee and relief initiatives......War, aggression, and nuclear proliferation should never be the answer to political, territorial, religious, or any other difference."


