



Dear Parishioners,

Jesus speaks again in the gospel about the importance of having faith in him, as true believes will inherit eternal life. In the meantime, before that occurrence Jesus feeds us with the finest anyone could offer: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live for ever". Not only do we partake of the right spiritual food, this leads us to look after those who experience not only deprivation spiritually but also physically. Many asylum seekers and refugees are deprived of the jobs we take for granted and naturally then continue to have difficulties with feeding their families or having the basic necessities. We do at least our little bit here at St Mary's by having the August month set aside to help asylum seekers and refugees. Fortunately, as in the past and this weekend Sr Brigid Arthur from the 'Brigidine Aslyum Seeker Project' will fill us in about some of the more recent happenings in our nation in regards the asylum seeker and refugee situations. You will also find on the bulletin the items of tinned foods we need to be brought back for next Sunday 15th August or dropped into the St Mary's School during the week if you are able us in our endeavours. Throughout Australia we are celebrating the Feast of Mary MacKillop this weekend, especially as her feast day falls on a Sunday for a change. Maybe you know her story or would like some further details as I give a short synopsis of her life. Mary was born in Melbourne in 1842 to Scottish immigrants. After her father made poor business deals, her family fell upon hard times. At fourteen, Mary had to go to work to help provide for her mother and younger siblings. While working as a governess four years later, she met Father Julian Tenison Woods and confessed to him her desire to live for God alone. Six years later after that, she was able to follow that desire and join Father Woods in the founding of a new order to educate the rural poor. Mary took vows and became "Mary of the Cross" and her brother converted a stable for their first school room. Responding to the isolation of colonial families, Mary pioneered a new form of religious life to provide education for their children. The order grew rapidly, and within three years of the founding, there were eighty-two sisters and twenty-three schools. Mary Mackillop and her sisters shared the life of the poor and the itinerant, offering special care to destitute women and children. We are lucky to have Mary of the Cross MacKillop as our first designated Australian saint.

Although the religious order, Faithful Companions of Jesus, came to rescue our Williamstown Catholic School from likelihood of closure due mainly to lack of helpful funds from the Government, they did not have the available sisters to continue their initial support. Luckily, Mary MacKillop's religious sisters came to support the continuation of what is now proudly the longest running school in Victoria: St Mary's Williamstown. Looking back, the Sisters of St Joseph continued their great mission here for 99 years and now we are still graced by several sisters located at 16 Esplanade, next door also at 114 Cole Street and the house Mary MacKillop personally came to purchase at 61 Melbourne Road. It is worth noting that "The Global Catholic Climate Movement "is now known as the "Laudato Si Movement". The organisations new name, announced during a livestream last Thursday incorporates the Franciscan phrase "Laudato Si" which is Italian for "praised be to you", and forms the basis of Pope Francis' message in his wonderful 2015 encyclical letter "Laudato Si" (On Care for Our Common Home) Consequently it is nice to see that beginning on the Feast of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, to pray "for our earth" from an environmental perspective and to pray to " set us free from our Covid-19 Pandemic", a few locals including local Josephite Sister, Therese Quinn have set a vigil this week of 'One minute silence each day at 12noon'. All can pray for this and do this in their own homes or at another time that might be more suitable during this week.

If you have a child from grade 3-5 with a possible interest in **altar serving** whether male or female, please look at the item enclosed. The altar serving practise for that will be between 4-5pm next Sunday in St Mary's Church on August 15th

Any loose money that is over \$10 this weekend I will put towards the CatholicCare collection that is supposed to take place this weekend. I have already put \$500 of our Parish money towards this annual collection - so any money you put on the plate over the \$10 will go towards offsetting the \$500 sent this week, otherwise the rest \$10 and under will go to the normal presbytery support. 


ACRATH's 2 month fundraising campaign led into 30th July–World Day Against Trafficking in already donated, thank you.
