GOSPEL: LUKE 14:25 – 33

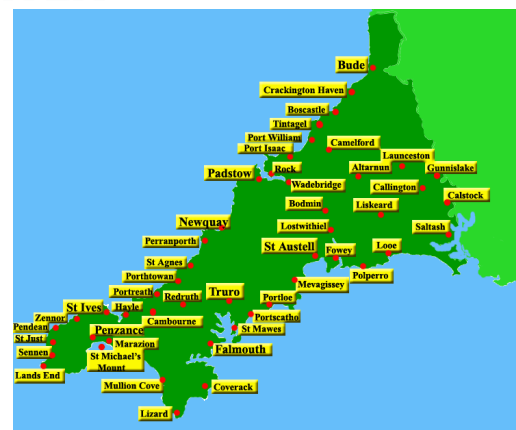
Great crowds were travelling with him, and he turned and addressed them, "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost to see if there is enough for its completion? Otherwise, after laying the foundation and finding himself unable to finish the work the onlookers should laugh at him and say, 'This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish.' Or what king marching into battle would not first sit down and decide whether with ten thousand troops he can successfully oppose another king advancing upon him with twenty thousand troops? But if not, while he is still far away, he will send a delegation to ask for peace terms. In the same way, every one of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple."

FR. GREG'S TRAVEL DIARY

I have travelled from my Catholic side of the family in Cork, Ireland now over from the southern most part of Ireland to the southern most part of England, Cornwall - a very pretty County. Over the last few days I have walked the 6 kilometres from my Penzance accommodation to the old village of "Trythall", the still existing "Trythall School" and gone that extra few kilometres out of my way to visit the Gulval Church of 1257. The town of "Trythall" was a small but strong village of small people, Cornish miners - some say the best miners in the world. Almost all have moved on to other places and the only real centre of life there now is the "Trythall School". I was told by a few people that although it is a small government school of only 69 primary age students, it has a very good reputation and record of innovative teaching. It was quite an experience for me to photograph it and walk around its lovely rural grounds. Although most of the Trythalls' were Methodist in origin, they must have had some influence at the local Anglican Church! Due to the shrinking of the mining population, this small Anglican Church ceased to exist in 1885. However, the "Trythall altar" was shifted to the Gulval Anglican Church nearby in Penzance and the "Harris Chapel" was renamed the "Trythall chapel". When I arrived at the Gulval Church, I rang the Anglican Warden Roy Mathews and he kindly opened up the Church and explained many things to me. He was proud to inform me that his great grandson had just been baptised there, the eighth generation including himself, who had been baptised at the same font! The list of vicars and previous Catholic Priests (before King Henry V111) dates back to 1257. I was pleased to be shown the "Trythall altar" and the "Trythall pulpit" in the same chapel and naturally asked Roy to take a photo of me next to them for the sake of posterity. The Trythall's must have been midgets, as the pulpit was only about half my size in height - I know my grandfather was a proud 4' 10" in height - obviously not basketballers.

PASTORAL WORKER

St. Mary's - Williamstown Parish—PART-TIME



St. Mary's community Williamstown possesses a good cross section of ages, has many gifted parishioners in leadership positions, and would be an excellent choice for a person wanting to be an important part of an already dynamic Christian Community. Accordingly, we are seeking the employment of a suitably qualified person for this role commencing 1st February, 2020. This is a part-time position, two days per week, but also entails being present for a minimum of one weekend Liturgy, with the requirement for additional hours during the Christmas, Easter and Confirmation periods. Therefore the normal 20 hours per week may be extended by mutual agreement. The successful applicant will work with the Parish Priest, and with the administration staff of the parish, as well as liaising with the school staff, particularly the RE Coordinator. We want an applicant who believes in moving our parish along a 21st century model, keeping in mind the principles of Vatican II. The remuneration will be in accordance with a Pastoral Worker position but is dependant upon the qualifications of the applicant. The position involves:

1. LITURGY

Assisting with creative liturgy for the three weekend masses, coordinating with the music ministry teams, providing the coordination of music at particular masses, providing the Prayers of the Faithful etc. Certain liturgies during the year would need to further the causes of asylum seekers, Aboriginal reconciliation and Christian marriage, such as the annual blessing of couples at a 'marriage anniversary' weekend. The re-energising of our parish liturgy team is also an important step in the right direction.

2. GOVERNMENT/PRIVATE SCHOOL PROGRAM

Coordinating a program to be delivered by trained catechists for Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation.

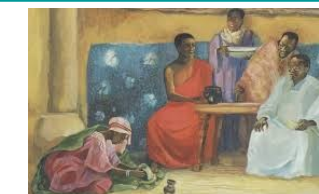
