



Dear Parishioners and Visitors.

Last week's **Feast of the Ascension** of Jesus into heaven was not an abandonment but a promise: "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back again and take you to myself, so that where I am you also may be (John 14:3) Everything we need to receive that promise has been given to us.

In line with the Ascension on this weekend we start the usual winter trifecta: Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, Feast of Corpus Christi. This Feast of Pentecost – think of it as Holy Mother Church's own feast day- assures us each year that despite all the problems that may emerge on the human scene, the Lord himself sanctifies and animates his Church with the Spirit who guides us to all truth (cf Jn 16:13) And on a personal level, just as the Holy Spirit formed the sacred humanity of Jesus in the womb of the Blessed Virgin, the Spirit's mission is to remake each of us as copies of that great Masterpiece. We are, after all, not merely followers of Christ's ideas, we are Christians- other Christs. We would do well to ask ourselves repeatedly: "Do you not know that you are the temple of God, that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" (1 Paul to the Corinthians 3:16)

Last week I explained why there would be a collection this weekend for the **Australian Catholic Clergy Remuneration Fund.** Some people think that priests can live on the smell of an oily rang – as the old saying goes! I have known many who live very frugal lives but a priest truly needs a stipend which is a fixed regular sum paid to clergy. One has to pay for travel expenses to get to the annual holidays destination, holiday accommodation, health insurance, expenses for petrol and maintenance of a car, the buying of a car if there is no leasing arrangement as in some bigger dioceses, ideally money for a hobby such as golf equipment and annual golf fees. There are always many minor expenses as for every single person such as chemist supplies. Accordingly, ACCRAF (Australian Catholic Clergy Assistance Fund) was set up in 1986 under the authority of the Australian Bishops Conference and in conjunction with the National Council of Priests of Australia to meet a particular need for adequate clergy remuneration. It is mainly the individual priests of Australia and/or their Priests Remuneration Funds that are supplying the money needed to give priests a minimum set stipend, especially for outback areas. For instance, many priests travel huge distances to celebrate Masses for smallish rural congregations with very little money able to go on the plate. Two dioceses, Broome and Geraldton are at this stage having great difficulty with money on the plate. This has meant Broome diocese 'Remuneration Fund' has been given \$170, 367.40 during last year by ACCCRAF, but the money is quickly going down in the fund from previous years. Although last month Geraldton diocese applied for \$90,000 for the next year to cover their 14 priests plus 3 now recently ordained last week, I on behalf of ACCRAF could only authorize half that amount to be sent to their 'Remuneration Fund'. ACCRAF continues to be a valuable source of support for priests in dioceses that do not have adequate income to provide for the appropriate assistance of their clergy. ACCRAF is administered by a committee of three as required by its statutes, one from the National Council of Priests, namely myself, one from contributing funds and one from recipient funds. The bottom line mainly is that priests who could be greedy by taking a better wage/living allowance are giving to priests in Australia who are not as well off. Many of these priests as in Broome are working in mainly aboriginal areas where even less money comes on the plate. Although it is only mainly priests helping out other priests with their deficiency of income, I have decided to hold a special collection at the Masses this weekend for ACCRAF. If anyone wants to give me a cheque for ACCRAF anytime in the future I will send it on to our National Council of Priests headquarters who have a bank account with the Catholic Development Fund for ACCRAF. This helps me and the ACCRAF committee to respond to the needs of those priests in outback Australia who deserve a just stipend. I appeal to your usual generosity but understand that there can be many other different priorities on your plate.
