



feast day is now celebrated on 11th October each year, in honour of the great ecumenical Council that he convened in 1962. Unfortunately unable to be in the parish myself this Tuesday morning as I will be at the Port Phillip Gaol Mass in Laverton as I take my part on the priests roster of the area for that prison facility on the day.

The Columban Fathers are very similar to us diocesan priests in that they normally work in a parish setting for the good of the parishioners of that area. The main difference being that "we" stay in Australia and within the confines of our diocese and the Columbans work overseas in countries that are in need of extra priests to help out in their parishes. Sometimes through illness or age they come home to their own country of Ireland, America or Australia to rest for a while at their mother house, such as at Strathmore in Victoria before returning if their health or situation improves. Hopefully within the next few weeks I can inform you about the Columban Korean Martyrs which comprised one American and six Irish priests who gave their lives in 1950 during the Korean War. Anyway, I will give you a glimpse of one of them, the American Columban priest about whom I read in that wonderful Columban magazine 'The Far East'. Continued...

Fr Emil Kapaun was from Kansas. He arrived in Korea in July 1950 as an army chaplain. Fr Emil died of pneumonia and malnutrition in a Chinese run prisoner of war camp in North Korea on 23<sup>rd</sup> May 1951 at the age of 35. Fr Emil was remembered by his fellow soldiers as a man of great compassion, of outstanding courage and selfless service to anyone in need. He was awarded the Medal of Honour - the highest military award for valour. His acts of bravery and service on the battle field were noted by numerous fellow soldiers. Among many acts of self-sacrifice and encouragement, he was credited with saving the life of a wounded United States soldier by bravely brushing aside the rifle of one intent on killing him. He picked up the wounded man and carried him to safety. In late 1953 a memorial chapel was built in his honour from contributions by fellow United States troops who knew him.

Bishop Hilton Deakin's funeral will be held at St Patrick's Cathedral this Thursday at 10:30am -all are welcome.
