

### Dear Parishioners and Visitors

"May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all." These last words are taken from St Paul's greetings to fellow Christians of different early church communities and spell out in Holy Scripture our belief in God being Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Of course, this was defined by an assembly of a big number of bishops gathered at Nicea (in Turkey) in 325 AD. 
- 1. If you are a non-Catholic and wish to look into the Catholic Faith exploring without necessarily signing on the dotted line.
- 2. If you are a Catholic and wish to understand better a number of important faith areas.
- 3. If you are a Catholic but were only baptized and now feel the need to receive other sacraments of the Catholic Church.

Although this group will **first meet on Tuesday July 12 at 7pm at St Mary's Presbytery** the time and day can be tailored to the time constraints or needs of the group as we have done in the past. Maybe you would like to know some of the topics that are covered:

The Bible, the Birth of the Church, Mary and the Saints, The Sacraments of the Church, The Structure of the Mass, The Meaning of Holy Week, Conversion: A life long process, The Role of the Laity, Church History, Prayer, Christian Moral Living, The Dignity of Life, Social Justice, Ecology etc. The questions of the

participants often lead to the exploration of a different area of faith.

The Way of the West (WOW) committee acts on behalf of St Mary's parish to work towards alleviating the plight of refugees and asylum seekers.

Asylum seekers have left their own countries and come to Australia because their lives and those of their families were at risk. Many of them have spent years in detention, to the detriment of their physical and mental well-being.

When they are released from detention it is imperative that they find a job to support themselves and/or their families. Having work is known to be an important part of their rehabilitation. To be able to earn and contribute, and have some structure to their lives, helps restore their dignity and sense of self-worth. But because of the trauma they have suffered, it is hard for them to find and keep work. Consequently, asylum seekers need to be supported to make the transition to employment. They need understanding employers and a supportive community who are willing to give them a chance and, when they fail, be willing to give them another chance.

In reflecting on what we can do as a parish to support asylum seekers and refugees to find and keep work, the WOW committee believes it is important to obtain the employer perspective. Accordingly, we would like to convene a roundtable discussion with people in our parish who are involved in the recruitment of employees, to better understand the employer's perspective and what might help employers consider giving an asylum seeker or refugee an employment opportunity. We are particularly interested to hear from those involved in recruiting into industries that are most likely to be suitable for asylum seekers and refugees: manufacturing, warehousing, construction, transport and information technology. We are planning to hold the roundtable at 7.30 on 22<sup>nd</sup> June at the presbytery.
