

### Dear Parishioners.

My Victorian priest friends on annual holidays in November do not always feel like going to Mass! We do not always go to Mass because we feel like it! For instance, in Byron Bay on annual holidays over the last more than 40 years there have been a variety of Parish Priests. There have been 6 so far come and go and be assigned to different parishes within the Lismore diocese within that period. Some we liked immensely, one we found ok and one we considered extremely boring. We did not keep going to Mass on a weekend to the church there because of the priest! We do it for various reasons, such as a commitment in a relationship to God, the importance of hearing the Word of God and receiving Eucharist, the need to receive wisdom from God, the need to help the Christian Community by responding appropriately within the worship to the responses etc etc. Likewise, I think during Lent that we as a Community at St Mary's can improve in our responses to God! Some do not know them, some know them well, some should learn them. It is our responsibility to worship God appropriately, not by keeping silent as Mass as is not a private prayer, but a public action.

Accordingly, a small step along the way is to have and learn a different 'Mystery of Faith 'response for Lent. You will find on the opposite page that response: please make an effort to learn it during Lent – it is not an arduous duty. I do my part in preparing a different sermon every week, and preparing other aspects of the Mass, I think the least I should expect is that 'all' of you not just 'some' of you know the responses. Love of God is the first commandment, and as Jesus states the second is love thy neighbour as yourself.

The Lenten season has a twofold character:

It recalls baptism or prepares for it;

It stresses a penitential spirit.

It is a period where you pay more attention to the Word of God. I have a few spare bibles if one needs a more modern translation of the bible

like the New Revised Standard Version. For some it might be an idea to take a new scripture passage to read from the New Testament - every day in Lent. It is something extremely worthwhile. I would suggest as the readings of year B are being used this year that you might read something like a page a day and reflect on the words or be encouraged by the great success of the early Church in the 'Acts of the Apostles'. The 'Acts of the Apostles' follow the gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. It is a book everyone should read and reflect on at least once during one's life time. You won't regret it. Another aspect in line with this during Lent is to take part in more ardent prayer. For example: Mass attendance during week, family prayer, a visit to a church, making the Stations of the Cross Friday evenings, praying the rosary, or in other ways.

During Lent, penance should not only be internal and individual but also external and social. One aspect of this to help others: for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or over-burdened, or in other ways.

Lent is a period of self-denial: for example, not eating sweets or dessert, giving up some form of entertainment to spend time with the family: limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country or elsewhere - Project Compassion is a major means of expressing our selfdenial in Australia. - On 1st January 2021 CatholicCare Melbourne has officially merged with CentreCare Ballarat and CatholicCare Sandhurst to form CatholicCare Victoria – one social service agency serving all four Catholic dioceses across the State of Victoria
- On 8 December 2020, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception marked the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the proclamation of St Joseph as the Patron of the Universal Church. Pope Francis chose this occasion to declare a "Year of St Joseph" for the entire Catholic Church running from Dec 8, 2020 to Dec 8, 2021
- St Joseph's by the sea, on February 23rd there will be an on line reflection on the Good Samaritan story and Fratelli Tutti, Pope Francis latest encyclical. The second chapter of Fratelli Tutti is a reflection on the Good Samaritan story.


