#### **GOSPEL: JOHN 4:5 - 42**

So he came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of land that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well.



It was about noon. A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" (For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans.) Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." The woman said to him, "Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the cistern is deep; where then can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this cistern and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?" Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life.".....

Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him because of the word of the woman who testified, "He told me everything I had done." When the Samaritans came to him, they invited him to stay with them; and he stayed there two days. Many more began to believe in him because of his word, and they said to the woman, "We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world."

#### Dear Parishioners

As sometimes the responses during the Mass are not as ideal as I think they could be, I would suggest for instance if you have not learnt by heart during the week 'The first acclamation of faith' as listed on top of page 3 of the bulletin, then it should not too much of an imposition to try and learn it during this week. We are all in this together. The Mass is not meant to be just a passive experience but an engagement of the whole congregation: heart, mind and soul.

This week there will be individual reconciliation for grade 3 children from St Mary's school and similar grades from parishioner's children from other schools. I follow a beautiful format that was handed down mainly from your former beloved Parish Priest, Fr Noel Oliver. Over a 10-minute period for each family:

- The family are introduced to me.
- We gather around Baptism font set up at back of altar and talk about the significance of Baptism in respect to Reconciliation.
- The child sits in a chair opposite me for confession of sin etc. near the Mary altar area, in sight of parents over the other side listening to background music near the organ area.
- We gather again in the middle as a family group, pray the Our Father together and offer each other a sign of peace.
- The family have a photograph with their child at back of altar in front of big stained glass window area. Thankfully families are very pleased with this format.

There will be 'A New Parishioners Luncheon' on Sunday May 31<sup>st</sup> from 11:30am – 1:30pm. These have been very successful over the years, not only have new parishioners enjoyed it but those on our Parish Council have appreciated getting to know our new parishioners. If not already done so if new parishioners over the last year could you please fill in a 'Registration Form' from back table (school side) that would be great.

I have probably already said enough over the last two weeks regarding advice taken by the Australian Bishops in regards to 'novel coronavirus'.

Basically a few things came through:

- Better to receive communion in hand rather than the tongue.
- Special ministers to thoroughly sanitize hands before and after distributing holy communion.
- Water stoups at entrances are dry so as not to spread virus through that means.
- The above is the main thing from the bishops but if things go from bad to worse over the months I suggest as the Archbishop does that we may give a smile or a bow of respect to each other during the "Rite of Peace' instead of our normal handshake or kiss between partners. I hope it does not get to that stage but you never know.

At the **8:30am Mass, Chloe Lanyon will take her next step to becoming a Catholic**, with 'The Rite of Election'. We wish her every blessing. The next big step will be at the Easter Vigil.
