Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

Welcome 1st Communicant's. However, like a marriage – the faithful continuation of the journey is the main thing. Yes, **today is important for many children receiving their first Eucharist** but the faith journey is a continuing journey fraught with many trials. Will one step up to the plate in that journey or be caught up by the cares and worries of life? Some of these children will follow the faith with determination and others will drop off. We pray for the former rather than the latter as we wish their happiness and not their failure in the faith. **Parental example will be the foundation stone needed** otherwise who will guide them and give them example about prayer, Eucharist and the living out of the message of love!

Thanks for all who have supported me in my work as a committee member for ACCRAF (Australian Catholic Clergy Remuneration Assistance Fund). From our collection last week, I will be sending remitting in excess of \$1,500 to our National Council of Priest headquarters for the use of ACCRAF. I will wait until Friday in case further funds are received prior to sending on your contributions. Thanks for your help for outback priests not able to secure a just remuneration to live on in vast rural areas of Australia.

Some state school org anisations in various states of Australia disseminate outright lies, exaggerations or at the very least great ignorance of the cost to the Australian taxpayer for the running of Catholic schools. For instance, recently the chief executive officer of the NSW Catholic schools sector noted the following: "Ernst & Young (EY) has independently calculated that under current funding arrangements, the operation of almost 600 Catholic schools in NSW resulted in a net saving in recurrent government spending of \$480 million in 2018. This would rise to \$2.56 billion in cumulative savings in the five years to 2022," Mr McIcerney said. "..... EY's modelling also found that if the NSW Government were required to educate the students currently enrolled in NSW Catholic schools, it would need to spend up to \$7.9 billion in capital to develop the necessary schools." Mr McInerney said some 90% of the funding used to build or upgrade Catholic schools – which educate one in five NSW students – currently comes from private contributions (like parishes), parents and families. "This report shows that rather than drawing funds away from government schools, NSW Catholic schools actually free up funding for governments to invest in public schools and other areas."

As I mentioned previously, some state school representatives or state school affiliated unions are capable, in pursuit of their own selfish agendas, to be guilty of either outright lies, exaggerations or at the very least display incredible ignorance of our Catholic school system and its financial support to the total education costs of children throughout the whole of Australia. By the way, two years ago we were educating 22% of Australian children. I am not sure what the figure would be now but it would have to be at least 20%.
