Dear Parishioners

There is a danger that Christmas becomes something that concerns only the children. While it's true that a child (the Christ Child) is at the centre of Christmas, Christmas concerns us all.

The prophet Isaiah talked about the coming of a very special child (First Reading). But there is no reason to believe that he knew just how special that child would be. Every King of David's line was an embodiment of God's promise to be with us. But Christians believe that Isaiah's prophecy only found its complete fulfilment in Jesus.



The Second Reading and the Gospel reveal to us the true identity of this special child (Jesus). No prophecy is fully understood until after its fulfilment.

Both St Paul and St Matthew make it clear that, in the first place, Jesus was the Son of David. This was so because Joseph, his legal father, was descended from the line of David. David is one of the greatest figures of the Old Testament. He succeeded Saul as King of Israel. It was he who united the scattered tribes and formed them into a nation. Even though he sinned, he repented. Another sign of his greatest is the fact that he forgave his enemies. Many times in the Gospel Jesus is called 'Son of David'.

Some parishioners wanted me to repeat the basic message I gave at the end of the Masses last weekend of possible helps to truly appreciate the coming of Christ this Christmas and not just let it be 'a semi non-event' in our lives if that came to pass! Accordingly, here again on paper are the 9 suggestions of possibilities - not obviously exhaustive.

- 1. Help the St Vincent de Paul Society help a family this Christmas: the proceeds of the candle box in at the Mary altar area always goes to the St Vincent de Paul Society.
- 2. Keep loyal to using every day the Advent booklet handed out at start of Advent entitled 'Incarnate'.
- 3. If not already had the chance to go to this weekend Reconciliation Service I have listed in the Parish Calendar three other opportunities including the normal Saturday one at 10:00am.
- 4. If working still at home maybe take the time to come to one of the weekday Masses.
- 5. Reflect some more in your own quiet time on the Gospel of this weekend as per front page of bulletin.
- 6. Pick out a page of Scripture to reflect on such as Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Or choose to read a few pages of the Acts of the Apostles straight after the Gospels - more than well forth the encouragement to your faith. ..Continued

- 8. Start looking up Christmas Carols and play for a few days to put you in the mood for the coming of the most important person in human history into our World. We show our appreciation to Him when we play those magnificent carols: Silent Night (Bing Crosby), Away in a Manger (Bing Crosby/Frank Sinatra), Hark the Herald Angels Sing, O Holy Night (Nat King Cole), O Little Town of Bethlehem. O Come All Ye Faithful, The First Noel (Frank Sinatra), It Came Upon A Midnight Clear (Frank Sinatra), Do You Hear What I Hear, What Child is This.
