As we have a big Archdiocese it is also an opportunity to renew our clergy friendships and understanding as we all in different parishes try to work for the Lord.



As "the Swag" winter edition has arrived I would like to explain at least the first 20 pages. Sometimes there are articles that not all priests or all laypeople will entirely agree with in "the Swag". However, if we are not open to others viewpoints then we can shut the gate to our own development, and the development of others who don't always have to think like us,

as for instance some have had a different and sometimes quite difficult road to travel in life. So, let us share different viewpoints!

Page 3- Unfortunately Chairman spells out the truth that our National Council of Priests group is ageing and that with a much higher percentage of non-Australian born priests coming into our country they are not used to joining priests' organisations.

Page 4 - Just a few general comments and reminisces of a cancer scare from the present Editor of "The Swag."

Page 5 - I wouldn't agree with everything that is being said in this article but would agree with some of his conclusions.

Page 6-7 - All parishioners should read this one as it further opens our eyes to a person who has had to struggle with both their identity and sexuality. It is a sad one but hopefully we can be do better as a Church. Page 8-9 - For those who like history this is a great read and some really interesting early Australian Catholic facts

Page 10-11- It is a worthwhile article on the need for a greater synodal approach in our Church.

Page 11-13 - This is a story of a marvellous Australian religious woman.

Page 14-15 - This is more aimed at clergy or religious needing to engage with a world and a Church in crisis. Pastoral Supervision plus spiritual directors being a part of ongoing formation.

Page 16 - I think the author is far too critical of a process aiming at restorative journeying for survivors of abuse within the Catholic Church. As the 'PATHWAYS" process has only just started in the last year I think the author should sit back for a while as I believe "Pathways Victoria" seems a good way in heading towards the future of pastoral care for some who need it most.

Page 17-18 - Unfortunately in regards the Australian Catholic Church's Plenary Council the author has valid points to make as the pandemic has greatly slowed the process and allowed some very traditional groups to have far too much of a say. Time will tell but I hope for the best as I know there are some very good delegates and more moderate voices around. Hopefully they speak up louder for some of the changes that need to be made within the Australian Church and not just accept the status quo. I think the author is a bit hard on 'all the bishops' as within their ranks most of them are good people. However, it probably needs to be said that a minority of those very traditional types like Archbishop Fisher of Sydney have far too much to say.

Page 19 Despite what I have said in last sentences there is light in the tunnel as this article stresses. We pray that light will come fully to bear as there could be some very good signs for the universal church and its governance structures.

Page 20 I have found it a bit confusing with the structures under "Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples" but this is a good article in this regard. It is nice to hear about the lovely work of the French lady Pauline Marie Jaricot.
