

Dear Parishioners and Visitors

Christmas is a wonderful feast. Christmas celebrates the presence of God in our world and in our daily life. Christ was born in human flesh in order to draw those who are willing to listen and obey into unity with God and with one another. Therefore, I am sure Jesus challenges us at this time to see the divine spark in others that we meet and equally to be the divine spark for others. We are another Christ in our world and God indeed lives in us. We encourage that deepening of Christ in us through prayer, through listening to his Word, through gathering in His name and through our attempts of unselfish love for others. On the other hand, we can read about people every day in our newspapers who lower themselves from the human to a sort of semi animal level, whereas we are lucky enough to appreciate the lifting of ourselves, not without our own efforts and God's help, to a divine level. Our human level meets the divine and we are so much more at peace through that and then are able to have a deeper joy. It is a life long process of transformation, but progress can definitely be made and we then can be people of greater hope. Our hope can then feed our faith and our love.

We welcome this weekend Tom Christie, as a 7th year seminarian, who will be staying at the Williamstown presbytery over the next few months or at least until after his diaconate ordination in probably February or March 2022. Tom has grown up in West Essendon, and finished his secondary education at St Bernard's College in Essendon. One thing you will learn is that he is a Saint - a St Kilda supporter!! I was telling Tom that my grandfather first played for St Kilda in 1903 before ending his career from 1907 – 1912 for Melbourne. My Melbourne supporting mother eventually married a die-hard bulldog's supporter from Footscray! As I informed one dismayed grade 6 child a few years back: "My grandfather was a dog (paternal side of family), my father was a dog and I am a dog"!! We hope Tom Christie finds Williamstown to be a second home for him as he stays with us over the coming months. He has had a reasonably long journey to priesthood, having studied 4 years of podiatry, 5 years practising as a podiatrist, now just finished 7 years of studies for priesthood. Hopefully the next 40 or so years as a priest after ordination in 2022 goes well for him and that he is very effective as a pastor of God's people.


