

Dear Parishioners,

On this weekend 50 years ago (21st Feb precisely) 27 youngish men including myself went to the seminary at Werribee. 9 became priests, one became a permanent deacon. 7 have now reached a higher destination with God, and out of the 20 now still alive 14 of us have arranged to meet in a restaurant in Melbourne on Sunday evening. Realistically with a very poor academic record I gave myself a 50/50 chance of lasting two years before I was shown the door! However, I thought it worth taking the big risk if God was actually calling me to something I rated as very important for the ongoing life of the Church. It is only mainly by the grace of God, much support from parishioners in various parishes and the support of my initial year mates at the time that I am able to rejoice 50 years later. I could not have wished for a better group to join at the time. It tended to be a sportier group – so that suited me down to the ground. We played football, cricket, squennis, ran in athletic carnivals, and now some of us play golf together. We have shared so many good anniversaries, good memories, mostly happy times, good holidays together. I am extremely thankful to the Spirit for calling me to that particular group of people of which by chance I happen to be the oldest. We will celebrate this event in a big way as we have got on famously together. Then we will get back to Lent!! Like starting the 1st day in the seminary, Lent is not unlike it. One changes ones patterns and starts on a different path and by the grace of God one comes out a better person. All the best in your journey of Lent as you start that process this weekend.

The Lenten season has a twofold character:

It recalls baptism or prepares for it:

It stresses a penitential spirit.

It is a period where you pay more attention to the Word of God. I have a few spare bibles if one needs a more modern translation of the bible like the New Revised Standard Version. For some it might be an idea to take a new scripture passage to read from the New Testament – every day in Lent. It is something extremely worthwhile. I would suggest as the readings of year B are being used this year that you might read something like a page a day from Mark's Gospel and reflect on the words or be encouraged by the great success of the early Church in 'the Acts of the Apostles'. The 'Acts of the Apostles' follow the gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. It is a book everyone should read and reflect on at least once during one's life time. You won't regret it. Another aspect in line with this during Lent is to take part in more ardent prayer. For example: Mass attendance during week, family prayer, a visit to a church, making the Stations of the Cross Friday evenings, praying the rosary, or in other ways.

During Lent, penance should not only be internal and individual but also external and social. One aspect of this to help others: for example, special attention to someone who is poor, sick, elderly, lonely or over-burdened, or in other ways.

Lent is a period of self-denial: for example, not eating sweets or dessert, giving up some form of entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor of one's own country or elsewhere - Project Compassion is a major means of expressing our selfdenial in Australia. Don't try everything but do something!
