

Dear Parishioners and Visitors.

Welcome 1st Communicant's and their families. However, like a marriage – the faithful continuation of the journey is the main thing. Yes, today is important for many children receiving their first Eucharist but the faith journey is a continuing journey fraught with many trials. Will one step up to the plate in that journey or be caught up by the cares and worries of life. Some of these children will follow the faith with some determination and others will drop off. We pray for the former rather than the latter as we wish their happiness and not their failure in the faith. Parental example will be the foundation stone needed otherwise who will guide them and give them example about prayer, Eucharist and the living out of the message of love!

Politicians are not usually the best listeners or the wisest people on this planet! Some people, such as Herald Sun columnist Susan O'Brien and Premier Daniel Andrews have had some poor end of life experiences with close relatives. Unfortunately, they have taken those limited life experiences and become so called experts in stressing the importance of the comfort of a dignified death with the wrong conclusions. Thus, they have not listened to the majority of palliative care agents and medical professionals. They usually want to enact something that brings them more votes and seemingly more adulation from strong minority groups as they try to pull the wool over the general public eyes by saying things for instance are done 'due to compassion reasons'! Rubbish! Accordingly, they have brought legislation in from last Wednesday to bring about 'Voluntary Assisted Dying legislation (VAD). This is despite the fact that there are ever increasing palliative care opportunities ('Mercy Palliative Care') as well as improving pain management opportunities also. They can talk about all the safety standards with new legislation but as you and I know with 'abortion legislation' these so called safety standards get gradually eroded after a while. Consequently, the bishops of Victoria have brought out a pastoral letter that was available from last weekend. I will leave it on both tables at back. I quote just a few important sentences from that pastoral letter:

- 'What is being referred to as 'VAD' is a combination of what in plain speaking is more commonly known as physician assisted suicide and euthanasia.
- Pope Francis has encouraged ordinary Catholics everywhere to resist euthanasia and to protect the old, the young, and the vulnerable from being cast aside in a 'throw- away culture'.
- Catholic hospitals and Catholic residential care organisations have shown great courage. They have united to find ways to model excellent care for their patients, and are committed to resisting calls to involve themselves in VAD.
- We object to the diminishment of the love that can be given and received in the last days of our loved ones.
- We will not abandon those we love, and we believe they have a right to be loved from the beginning to the end of their life.

"The Swag" has arrived once again. This is the Winter edition. I tend to read different articles over a month or two periods. There are always a few outstanding articles, but some may be in the front of the magazine and some in the back. This time on page 4 the editor gives a summary of several of the articles. Our new Chairman on page 3 of the National Council of Priests of Australia gives some lovely analogies. I have found it usually a privilege to look at the column on those priests and deacons who have returned to God within the last few months. It is often humbling to read their stories at the very back of 'the Swag" and although we have had priestly troubles these other men have been shining lights to their parishioners and others.
