FR. GREG'S TRAVEL DIARY

Sunday 29th September: Over this past month, I have walked through many French forests and heard on occasion, shots at deer, wild pigs and ducks. This day the shots were alarmingly close as the duck shooters were out in force. I was trying to not be taken for a ducks head as I travelled several kilometres at the side of the forest! I ducked my head on several occasions as I did not want to end up in the duck soup for that evening meal! I rose early as I needed to walk 35 km to the next town, Bazas. Whilst travelling through the wonderful village of La Reole I looked back over the river at the glorious view of the village's largest church and also at one of France's most beautiful and wide rivers, 'La Garonne'. Many a concert is held at La Reole church and I had attended one myself the previous evening. Richard the Lionheart was conqueror in the 1200's and would not let the Church be extended any further but still it possessed a radiant beauty. The Bazas Cathedral is designated as another UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE. The stained glass windows were exceptional especially towards the end of the day and I returned again the next morning to admire them once again. I had to trudge through wet grass on the other side of the La Garonne river and my socks were rather wet for most of the day. That side river path was not the easiest and along with the dampness of the early morning it made it hard-going. Towards the end of the day I was climbing up this long and steep hill next to a farm. As I drew half way up the hill, a crowd of about 40 people under a big tent starting waving at me and when I like a madman started waving back with my walking stick they beckoned me to join them! I trudged the 200 metres to the side of the farm and I became the "Australian celebrity guest" as they offered me food and wine on this Sunday afternoon where they were celebrating the grandmother's 90th birthday. We left on good terms and I felt energised to walk the final five kilometres! Monday 30th September: Richmond were no doubt still celebrating their Grand Final victory over the weekend. In the meantime I had only a short walk of 21kms to get to the next accommodation where the hostess of the day was in a good mood as her husband had bought her a new car! As it was going to be an easier day's walking I found a laundromat early in the morning and waited for the clothes to wash and then used the drier for another 15 minutes. In my travels I discovered that there were two very important things: keep yourself clean with a shower at the end of the day and keep your clothes clean and dried when a laundromat presented itself. Towards the end of the day I came across a German man 'Huggey'. We came across each other the next day and walked several hours together as we walked at the same pace.

Tuesday 1st October: It was again another long day walking 35kms. However, it was very beautiful walking through the 'LANDES FOREST'. This forest of millions of pine trees is the biggest man-made forest in not only France but Western Europe. It was established in 1857 and is supposed to be 10,000km². I again came across Huggey Firez of the previous day. Continued.....

We walked strongly together for four hours as we conversed wonderfully. He is a German married man of 55 who came from the Düsseldorf area of Germany. He works as a sales manager for Hoover. Like several others I came across, he was doing one of the famous four French pilgrimage routes a section at a time of a couple hundred kilometres. This is his fifth trip over the years of doing two to three weeks at a time and hopefully getting to the Spanish side as well. He was telling me he was a sky diver with about 150 jumps but his young wife at the time convinced him to give it up as he had a young family. He has also run every major marathon except for the London one. We had plenty to talk about. Hope all of you are well. I was very saddened to hear of the death of Kevin Kelly - no doubt there was a big funeral at St. Mary's last Monday. As Jesus said of the apostle Nathaniel 'a man incapable of deceit.' Kevin Kelly was like that - I hold his memory very highly and his family and he are in my prayers. Fr. Greg - Dijon (the mustard place) France.

PASTORAL WORKER—St. Mary's - Williamstown Parish—PART-TIME

St. Mary's Williamstown would be an excellent choice for a person wanting to be an important part of an already dynamic Christian Community. Accordingly, we are seeking a suitably qualified person for this role commencing 1st February, 2020. This is a part-time position, two days per week, but also entails being present for a weekend Liturgy, with the requirement for additional hours during the Christmas, Easter and Confirmation periods. The normal 20 hours per week may be extended by mutual agreement. The successful applicant will work with the Parish Priest, and with the administration staff of the parish, as well as liaising with the school staff, particularly the RE Coordinator. We want an applicant who believes in moving our parish along a 21st century model, keeping in mind the principles of Vatican II. The remuneration will be in accordance with a Pastoral Worker position but is dependent upon the qualifications of the applicant. The position involves:

- 1. LITURGY—Assisting with creative liturgy for the weekend masses, coordinating with the music ministry teams, providing the coordination of music at particular masses, providing the Prayers of the Faithful. Certain liturgies during the year would need to further the causes of asylum seekers, Aboriginal reconciliation and Christian marriage,.
- 2. GOVERNMENT/PRIVATE SCHOOL PROGRAM—Coordinating a program to be delivered by trained catechists for Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation.
