
GOSPEL: LUKE 19:1-10

Fun and games are about to start! All for the good in the long run though. There will be rehabilitation works on Cecil Street between Parker and Cole: expected to start Wednesday 2nd November, and will take approximately 10 weeks to complete. In accordance with the Environmental Protection Regulations construction works will carried out from 7am - 6pm Monday to Saturday. I would imagine (knowing some workers!!) they will be finished well before the 6pm Saturday deadline - so should not be great problem with our Saturday evening Mass and especially our Sunday Masses. However, if construction works are planned outside of these hours, I am told there will be notification in advance. As I intimated it should be great for us for the future as it is to do with road construction and drainage works. Most parishioners would not realise it I think - but we do have some semi-serious drainage problems and they mostly affect our school from the Cecil Street road/ or coming from higher ground into the Cecil street precinct. A few minor sink holes are a testament to that. Accordingly, hopefully these will be sorted out. There will be the installation of underground drainage, footpath replacement works, reconstruction of the existing kerb and channel, installation of raised crossings and the rehabilitation of the road pavement to rectify the poor road condition and mitigate flooding in the area.

Kalma who spoke last week from CatholicCare was very appreciative of the generosity of our parishioners as she took the envelopes back with her to CatholicCare headquarters. She was well aware that we probably did not get enough envelopes to distribute in the first place to put around the seats- so some more envelopes are on the school side table just in case anyone else wants to donate to CatholicCare. Kalma herself is a single mother with two children and she knows how hard it is to battle along at times in life without the correct support.

Compared to the Eastern suburbs there is not the same accessibility for Palliative Care services. Accordingly, we would like to encourage parishioners to be involved in this important ministry. A new partnership has opened between the ancient Order of Malta and Mercy Health in the western suburbs. In brief Palliative care is specialised care that helps one live well with a life limiting illness. The primary goal is to optimise the quality of life even though one possesses a progressive disease. There is a care for the whole person: physical, cultural, emotional, social and spiritual needs. There are a number of things that volunteers can do:

- Respite support to enable the care giver to have some 'time out'.
- Companionship for the patient.
- Transport for patients and carers to medical appointments
- Bereavement support by offering emotional and practical support.
- Administrative support assisting with task including mail outs, medical records and filing
- Biography volunteers listen, record and transcribe their life story.
- Dog walking
- Photography to help to create lasting memories
